## LUMBER OFFICE BEING MOVED

**BAKER, Mar. 2.**—It was announced sometime ago that the Oregon Lumber company would move its general office to Baker from Portland. E. H. Jones, auditor of the company arrived in the city yesterday and the move is now being made. W. C. Godden, manager of the company will arrive tomorrow as will E. E. Stoddard, Mr. Godden and Mr. Jones are both well known in Baker having resided here before.

## DEEP SHAFT TO BE SUNK SOON

**BAKER, Mar. 2.**—That he will sink a 1000 foot shaft at the Ben Harrison mine is the announcement made by W. C. Fellows, manager of the mine on his arrival in Baker from a three months' trip east. The most of the time was spent in Kentucky.

Mr. Fellows stated that the faith of himself and his associates in the mines of Eastern Oregon, is such that they believe by doing this they will make of their mine one of the greatest in the state and that he will start the work as soon as the snow in the higher mountains goes off. The cost of the shaft will be approximately \$150,000.

Mr. Fellows has spent many years in developing the Ben Harrison mine and the showing made with the ore bodies developed has been such as to give the owners of the properties confidence in undertaking the enlarged development plan.

The Ben Harrison mine is in the Greenhorn mountains, Grant county about 18 miles from Whitney. The mine is equipped with an up-to-date milling and flotation plant, with large hoist and all equipment necessary for extensive mining operations. It is one of the model mining camps of Eastern Oregon.

The Ben Harrison company is a close corporation, having four stockholders, and all the money put in the property is provided by the owners and not through the sale of stock.

## Income Tax Facts

Receipts Given on Request, Collectors. If request is made, are required to give to taxpayers written or printed receipts for income, excess-profits and war-profits taxes, stating the amount paid and the particular account for which such payment was made. Payments may be made either at the offices of collectors of internal revenue or branch offices, either in cash or by money order or check. Checks and money orders should be made out to the collector of internal revenue in the city in which the collector's office is located. For example: "Collector of Internal Revenue, Portland, Ore." The Bureau of Internal Revenue advises that payments be made either by check or money order, as this method saves a trip to the collector's office and insures avoidance of congestion during the closing days of the tax filing period. If a check received by the collector is not paid by the bank upon which it is drawn, the person by whom it was tendered becomes liable for the payment of the tax and all legal penalties and assessments which apply if the check had not been tendered.
