FARM BUREAU HELD MEETING

The Union County Farm Bureau met Tuesday evening in the Federal building in a regular business meeting.

A committee was appointed to confer with the county court to see if arrangements could be made to purchase squirrel poison to be sold to the farmers in this vicinity at cost.

Considerable discussion on the formation of a herd district was before the meeting.

High Huron reported that the timber farmers have pooled orders for over forty tons of land plaster to be used on alfalfa land. By ordering in large amounts a considerable saving was made.

The remainder of the meeting was spent in the discussion of the membership campaign and a tentative date for the annual farm bureau meeting was set. It will probably be held in La Grande on the 8th of April.

THRIFT SHOP SHOWN SUCCESS

The monthly report of the Red Cross Thrift Shop showing a balance above running expenses was read at the meeting of the shop committee Wednesday. At that time the committee spoke very highly of the fine cooperation they have received through the different organizations of La Grande and wished to thank every one who has so generously donated articles.

An interesting thrift display has been placed in the shop window showing the number of useful articles which can be made from what was considered cast off garments. From one dressing jacket, a dress for a four year old girl, a baby's jacket, two hoods for babies, and a hand bag were made.

FREEWATER MAN HAS ABSCONDED

PENDLETON, Mar. 2.—That Earl S. Rowe, who recently disappeared from Freewater where he has been cashier of the recently organized Bank of Freewater, took with him \$10,000.72 belonging to the bank's funds in addition to money which he had borrowed at various times was disclosed today in an action filed in circuit court by Peterson, Bishop and Clark in behalf of S. Eaton.

According to the information given in the complaint, Rowe had borrowed \$7,500 from the bank since November 8, 1921. Of this amount he had repaid \$3,500 which left him debtor to the institution to the extent of \$4,000. This was added from the sum of slightly more than \$1,000 which he is charged with having appropriated to his own use when he left.

Eaton declares in the complaint that the notes were assigned to him by the bank.

Rowe was formerly in a loan company at Spokane. He disappeared early in February and no trace of him has been secured except that his car was found deserted between Walla Walla and Wallula three or four days after his disappearance.

The Freewater banking institution has the backing of fruit men in the Walla Walla valley and is considered a very strong bank.

PRINCE IN LAHORE

LAHORE, British India, Mar. 1.—The Prince of Wales arrived here Saturday afternoon. He received a cordial welcome from large crowds notwithstanding that La-hore has been considered a storm center of unrest.
