JOFFE CONTROLS SOVIET DESTINY

 TASHKENT, Turkestan, Mar. 8.—The political destinies of the soviet governments here are controlled by Adolph A. Joffe, senior of the Brest-Litovsk treaty by which Russia withdrew from the world war and former Russian Soviet Ambassador to Berlin. (It was recently announced officially that he would be one of the Russian soviet delegates to the Geneva conference.)

Joffe is the chief of a central committee of five. One of his duties is to put into effect Moscow's instructions regarding relations with Amanullah Khan, the young and active Emir of Afghanistan and pretender to the Moslem Caliphate, now held by the Sultan at Constantinople.

The Emir of Bokhara has fled to Afghanistan, the Khan of Khiva is in prison at Moscow and the soviets are strengthening their power by attempting to build up the small landlords at the expense of the old

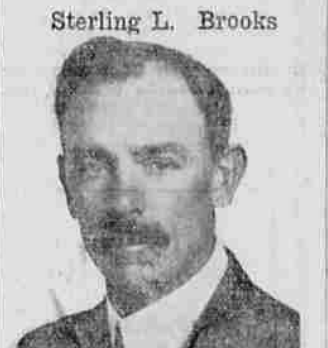
