(By Associated Press) LINCOLN, Neb., Mar. 7.—Seven Nebraska mothers, carrying from four to ten credit hours, have become the schoolmates of their daughters at the University of Nebraska. In the case of two of the mothers it is the realization of a girlhood ambition to attend college. The others are enrolled for individual purposes, one to study modern student life, and still another to theorize.

Mrs. U. C. Brecht is the mother of three children, all girls, and now her classmates. The entire family is studying dairy and animal husbandry. Daughter Emma and her mother, Mrs. Emma J. Kosch, frequently are mistaken for sisters in university circles. Mrs. Kosch is a sophomore, and besides, has two step-granddaughters in Colburn university. Art, communications and economics are found on Mrs. Kosch's card.

Mrs. Frederica Lau received her higher education in a German institution. So she entered the university with her two daughters to "be with Americans and learn their ideas." Philosophy, art, history, federal administration, economics, business administration and kindred subjects draw the mothers of four other students to the university. Two of these mothers resent it "rather hard to get back into the swing of school work—there is so much to unlearn that we learned before." MORE DANES ARE OUT OF WORK

(By Associated Press) COPENHAGEN, Mar. 7.—Unemployment in Denmark has been steadily increasing month by month, averaging 20 per cent for the whole of 1921 and culminating in December with 23.5 per cent of the total number of Danish workers, according to official reports.

High wages and the dumping of cheap central European goods are generally blamed for this state of affairs. Economists, however, are of the opinion that unemployment in Denmark, as elsewhere, is a natural consequence of the fact that more than half of Europe's population are unable to buy even the barest necessities. Some statisticians assert that the country is too small for her total population of less than 3,250,000.
