ATMOSPHERE IS WHAT COUNTS

(By Associated Press) SPOKANE, Wash., Mar. 10.—Put the down-and-out in an atmosphere which will make him ashamed to stay down and out," is to be the motto of the Salvation Army's new \$120,000 social and industrial home, which is to be finished and opened here sometime this month. It will not be a spoken motto, but it will be a psychological condition. The building represents the latest ideas in social work of this type. When thrown open, it will become the men's center of the Salvation Army in Spokane, and in an emergency, a thousand or more people can be cared for in it.

The big fresh air basement will house a number of dormitories, showers, and a reading and writing room. Then there will be a gymnasium, a soup kitchen for emergencies, an employment bureau, and hotel rooms for those able to pay. The auditorium and officers quarters complete the building.

LOCOMOTIVE TO GO TO COURT

Spokane Judge Allows Electric Car and Locomotive To Be Out On Bonds In Liquor Case.

(By Associated Press) SPOKANE, Wash., Mar. 10.—Though out of jail on \$15,000 bonds, an electric locomotive and freight car operated by the Spokane & Eastern railway and Power company over the company's interurban lines must be produced in the federal court in Spokane in May when it is expected the railway company will be tried for alleged transportation of liquor. Federal officers claim to have found five cases of liquor in the car at Colfax recently.

"It's silly," declared Waldo Palm, traffic manager of the company, in commenting on the temporary release from custody of the car. "The law was meant to cover only automobiles in which liquor is transported. A similar case in which a Pullman car was involved was tried recently and the car dismissed."

Bond for the release of the law-breaking rolling stock was posted personally by the officers of the company. The freight car is the property of the Great Northern railway, it is said, but it is on the Spokane and Eastern rails.
