ENTERPRISE, Mar. 11.—The stock of auto parts and supplies held by the Inland Motor company in its Enterprise garage was sold the first of the week to L. C. Smith of La Grande for approximately \$2000. Mr. Smith will move the goods to La Grande.

Daniel Boyd, the owner, will put it to use as a service station and storage house for autos. A competent man will be placed in charge. Mr. Boyd expects to rent it later to some one who wishes to put in a general garage.

The Inland Motor company is in bankruptcy and the property is in charge of a referee. The stock of goods was appraised at 65 per cent of inventory costs, making a total on this basis of \$2900. It was sold at 50 per cent of that price.

RESIGNATION OF ATTORNEY

Walter S. Burleigh Resigns As District Attorney of Wallowa County; Schaupt Succeeds.

ENTERPRISE, Mar. 12.—Walter S. Burleigh has resigned his office as district attorney, effective April 1, and Gov. Ben W. Olcott has appointed A. W. Schaupt of Joseph to the position temporarily to serve until the primary election, May 19. At that time nominations for the office will be made, it is expected, by both the republican and democrats. The surprise is that after the primary result is known, the governor will appoint the republican nominee who will hold office until the general election in November.

Mr. Burleigh will retire to his private practice of law. He will have his hands full for a year to come with his duties as attorney for the board of appraisers under the soldiers' bonus law. The attorney must pass on titles to land and advise the board all the way through the proceedings.
