PROPAGANDA CARRIED ON

(By Associated Press)
ANGORA, Turkey, Apr. 5.—Active propaganda is being carried on here at the seat of the Kemal Pasha's nationalist government, by a bolshevist trade delegation under Professor Goldan of Moscow university. The soviet aims were explained at a dinner to Kemal press representatives where the Russian spokesman said:

"We mean to work hard to bring about the recovery of Oriental peoples. They must free themselves from the grip of western influence. Turkey has given a brilliant example, and this will be followed by other Asiatic nations. We intend to open libraries, economic institutes, theaters and railways through out the country."

It was further announced that a Russian commission would shortly arrive in Anatolia to study the resources of the country. A Russian orchestra is giving a series of propaganda concerts in aid of the Russian famine.

NEW PRESIDENT IS TO SPEAK

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Apr. 5.—Dr. Marian Edwards Park, newly elected president of Bryn Mawr college, Bryn Mawr, Pa., will be one of the principal speakers at the 1922 con-

vention of the American Association of University Women, which will be held here April 5 to 9.

Miss Park has been active in an executive capacity in college work for a number of years, besides being a specialist in the classical studies, Greek and Latin. She has taught in the west for a number of years, as well as in the east.

Educated at Bryn Mawr, where she was a student under the retiring president of the institution, M. Carey Thomas, whom she succeeds, Miss Park was an instructor in the classics and acting dean of women at Colorado college, Colorado Springs, from 1902 to 1906. In 1913 and 1912 she was acting dean of Bryn Mawr college and in October, 1921, was chosen dean of Radcliffe college, Cambridge, Mass.

SPECIAL FOOD TRAIN RUNNING

WARSAW, Apr. 5.—All relief foodstuffs and supplies going through Poland to Russia will henceforth be transported at a reduction of 50 per cent of the regular charge.

The Polish ministry of railways has organized a special food train to carry Rumanian wheat from Rumania to the Russian frontier, the Rumanian rolling stock having proved insufficient to handle the provisions destined for the Russian famine regions.

HARDING BACKS HOME MOVEMENT

CHICAGO, Apr. 5.—President Harding has given his personal endorsement to the movement inaugurated by the American Homes Bureau for a national "Better Homes Week," to be instituted next October as an annual event.

"It gives me special pleasure," wrote President Harding in reply to a letter from William B. Wendorf, "to record my endorsement and approval of the 'Better Homes Week.' It may be true but it is everlastingly true that the home is the cornerstone of our civilization. Better homes, more attractive homes, homes whose occupants will find true refreshment and real inspiration to increased efforts for education and culture—such homes are the ones which assure greatest stability to our institutions, greatest security to our society. I cannot but feel that the effort you are making is one which deserves a wider projection and I would be glad if your example might presently be an inspiration to a nation-wide enterprise of the same kind."

OLD TIME STAGE DRIVER PASSES

OGDEN, Utah, Apr. 5.—Aaron Y. Ross, pensioned Wells-Fargo express manager who achieved fame by reason of his exploit in defeating single-handed seven train robbers who attacked an \$80,000 gold shipment at Montello, Nev., in 1883, died here Monday morning, at the age of 53 years.

Mr. Ross was born in Maine. He went to California in 1856, and later became a stage driver in Montana and Utah, where he had brushes with bad men and Indians.

In his Montello adventure Mr. Ross was wounded, but he killed one of the robbers and wounded four. These later were captured.

MORPHINE IS CONFISCATED

SEATTLE, Apr. 5.—Three pounds of morphine, said to be worth \$20,000 at retail prices were taken from C. P. Wilson, a mechanic on the steamship Silver State, according to customs officers who arrested him as he was leaving the vessel Sunday morning. Believing the morphine seized part of a huge cache aboard the Silver State, which arrived from the Orient recently, customs inspectors are searching the big liner end to end.

LEPERS GAIN IN WEIGHT

MANILA, P. I., Apr. 5.—One hun-

drod and ten lepers on Cullion Island gained from one to ten pounds each in three weeks under the influence of foods chosen by Miss Hartley Embrey, food chemist of the Rockefeller Foundation. Miss Embrey, who came to the Philippines several months ago for the purpose of studying the effect of different foods on the population and of improving the diet, has just returned from the island of Cullion, where 5,000 lepers are confined.

At the suggestion of Governor General Wood, Miss Embrey experimented with 200 lepers of the colony on Cullion, 150 adults and fifty children. The lepers under her treatment were separated from the other lepers, given uniform food of mango or fish for proteins, vegetables and rice or corn for carbony dates. The children were given one glass of milk each day. "Thirty five per cent of the adults and eighty per cent of the children gained in weight," said Miss Embrey. "We used an outdoor kitchen, cooked the foods, our selves and served them. The best thing about it was that the food we used was not expensive. The colony needs money and proper supervision. Without these not much can be hoped for."

Two booklets written by Miss Embrey, and published by the bureau of science, tabulating the results of her investigation of foods will be distributed throughout the Philippines.
