ANCIENT GAMES BEING REVIVED

Irish Games of Aonach-Tailtean at Tara Given Support by the Dail.

DUBLIN, Apr. 7.—Great interest is being shown in the revival in Ireland of the Aonach Tailtean, or ancient games of Tara. The Dail has unanimously voted substantial funds for their organization. The idea is to hold the games near here next August at about the same time as the Horse Show and to make their program similar to, but more extensive than, the Greek Olympics.

There will be, for example, competitions in rowing, motorboat and motorcycle racing, yacht racing, steed dancing and band competitions, while essentially Irish pastimes will have the most prominent place.

It is expected that the United States, Canada, Argentina, South Africa, Australia, and New Zealand, as well as Great Britain, will be represented in the international events. The definition of Irish competitors is stated to mean all amateurs whose grandparents on either side were of Irish birth, or either of whose parents are of Irish birth.

It is intended to make the event triennial. The chief moving spirit in the cause has been J. J. Walsh, member in the Dail for Cork City and now Irish Postmaster General. He has stated one of the objects to be that Ireland should be drawn closer to Europe by occasional international meetings in the capitals of the continent.

But it is Irish-American support that is principally looked for and an organizer has been appointed to look after the interests of the games in the United States, Canada and Newfoundland. He is Seamus Dobbin, a native of Derry, who has lived most of his life in Belfast and has been a famous athlete in the ranks of the Gaelic Athletic Association.

What the Olympic games were to the ancient Greeks the Tailtean "Aonach" (fair) was to the Gaels of old. It was held at a place now called Teltown, near Teanamanus Mor, about 30 miles northwest of Dublin. The place takes its name from Tailte, the foster mother of King Lugh, who, greatly grieved at her death, had her buried at Teltown with great pomp and ceremony. The burial mound is still to be seen. Lugh also ordered the fair and games to be celebrated periodically in honor of his foster mother.

The celebrated fairs of ancient Ireland were, it is believed, held in the vicinity of noted cemeteries and, so most probably, had their origin in ancient funeral ceremonies.

The Tailtean festival was celebrated at the beginning of August, and, in addition to the holding of contests of feats of strength, skill and endurance, there were military displays, chariot races, horse races and musical and poetical competitions. A great concourse of merchants assembled for trading purposes. Many matters of national and local importance were also decided at this festival. The annals of Ireland give 1168 as the last year in which the games were held in the ancient style. The athletic contests, however, were continued down to a comparatively recent date.

LUMBER ORDERS ARE GAINING

The noise of hammer and saw is increasing throughout the country, attended by a slow but sure gain in bookings of orders for lumber. Sales, not only by manufacturers to retailers but by retailers to ultimate consumers, are expanding, although, according to the American Lumberman, the market is not spectacular. Most retail lumber companies now conduct service departments to aid their customers in planning homes, and reports from all over the country indicate that these were never busier than they are today. People everywhere are thinking of building, and while in many cases their desire for homes has not yet resulted in the starting of construction, the number of operations in progress is steadily becoming larger. Purchases of lumber in the meantime are increasing, accompanied

by a price advance here and there on specific items for which there exists a strong demand. Generally speaking, the market remains firm, and there is every indication that the volume of trade will continue to expand.

For the first eleven weeks in 1922 the National Lumber Manufacturers' Association reports the following "vital statistics" in board feet: Production, 1,897,462,057; shipments, 1,836,536,892; orders, 1,968,072,801.

The above figures show clearly that orders so far booked this year have slightly exceeded production and that shipments have almost equalled production or orders. Of course, some shipments were of orders placed during 1921, but nevertheless it is evident that a very large part of this year's bookings has been rushed out, indicating that the stock was badly needed. In fact, never before have purchasers been so desirous of receiving prompt shipments as during recent months. Already an occasional complaint is heard that cars are becoming difficult to secure, and it seems that a car shortage is to be expected if improvement in the lumber business continues.

BOLSHEVISTS ARE EXCITED

MOSCOW, Apr. 4.—A little girl who had been snubbed by all her neighbors for years and then suddenly received an invitation to a party at the home of the rich little girl on the hill could hardly display more excitement than the Russian Bolshevik government has over its invitation to the Genoa conference.

They now feel they are in the social swim of nations and thus entitled to make faces at representatives of former Russian regimes who refused to play with them.

Unless, for reasons of policy which do not at present seem likely to be invoked, the Soviet delegation to Genoa should decide to appear there in the garb of the proletariat, the Bolshevik representatives will be sartorially as immaculate as any others attending the conference. They are going to be well dressed at their first party.

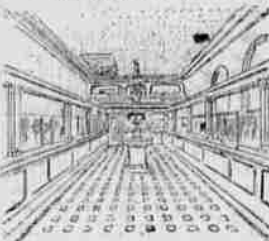
