

HINKLE FILES FOR SENATOR

Umatilla County Man to Run in Union, Umatilla and Morrow.

Political twists and curves in Umatilla county are said to be straightening out, although for a time it is admitted that some of the citizens over there were more or less unsettled as to the offices they would seek. Frank Sloan, who expected when he was in La Grande attending a taxpayers' meeting several weeks ago to run for the joint senatorship and J. T. Hinkle expected to run for the house from Umatilla's west end. Later they exchanged political aspirations and now Sloan has filed for his old seat in the house and Hinkle has filed for joint senator including Umatilla, Union and Morrow counties.

A copy of Mr. Hinkle's letter addressed to Secretary of State Kozar follows:

To Sam A. Kozar, Secretary of State of the State of Oregon, and to the members of the Republican Party and the Electors of Umatilla, Union and Morrow Counties, comprising the 19th Senatorial District in the State of Oregon.

I, Joseph T. Hinkle, reside at Hermiston, Oregon, and my post office address is Hermiston, Oregon. I am a duly registered member of the republican party. If nominated for the office of Senator in the primary election to be held within the 19th Senatorial District of the State of Oregon, the 19th day of May, 1922, I will accept the nomination and will not withdraw and if I am elected I will qualify as such officer.

If I am not nominated, I will not accept the nomination or endorsement of any party other than the one in which I am registered.

If I am nominated and elected I will, during my term of office, work for reduction in taxes by cutting down expenses and favor millage tax for schools with no additional appropriations. I will devote my time to the enactment of fewer and simpler laws and have no bills or net measures of my own to the my hands. I favor the present plan of highway and market road construction with reduction in overhead and no more bonds for the present.

Write to be re-elected after my name on the official ballot:
"Live within our means. Do our best for home and flag."

Kentuckian by Birth.

According to the biographical sketch of Mr. Hinkle he is a Kentuckian and was born in Cumberland County, Kentucky, Nov. 2, 1856, and is descended from the first English colonies settling at Jamestown, Va. He came to Pendleton, Oregon, in March, 1884, with his father and mother and four brothers and grew to manhood on a wheat ranch at the head of Juniper canyon in Umatilla county. He was educated in the country school at home, the old Pendleton Academy and the Willamette University and engaged in newspaper work and school teaching in Umatilla county for several years. In 1897 he was admitted to the bar and began the practice of law at Pendleton where he continued until 1909, when he moved to his ranch near Hermiston, where he has since resided and engaged in irrigation farming and law practice.

He served in the legislature during the sessions of 1913-1915 and was prominent as chairman of the House Committee on Irrigation and as an able floor leader. He was married to Miss Ada Cooper at Denver, Colo., Jan. 1, 1894. Mrs. Hinkle is a native daughter of Oregon and is of pioneer Cooper stock of Linn County. They have two children, Dale, a son now living in San Francisco, and Frances, a daughter now in attendance at the State Normal at Monmouth. Mr and Mrs. Hinkle are enthusiastic home

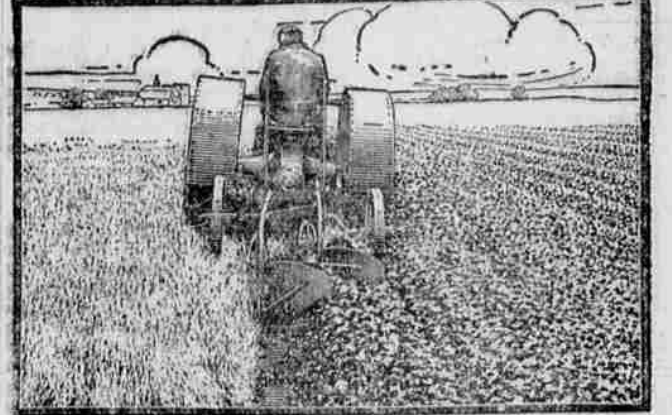

Richardson and Clara Richardson, the above named defendants: You and each of you are hereby notified to appear in the above entitled court and answer the complaint therein filed against you in the above entitled suit within six weeks from and after the date of the first publication of this summons as stated herein and you and each of you are hereby notified that if you fail so to appear and answer, the plaintiff will, for want thereof, apply to the court for the relief demanded in the complaint, to-wit: that there be decreed due and owing plaintiffs from each and all the defendants in this suit upon the notes set out in the
