BASEBALL WILL DRAW CROWDS

(By Associated Press) SAN FRANCISCO, Apr. 7.—Crowds larger than ever before, weather permitting, this year will jam the parks of the Pacific Coast Baseball League, William H. McCarthy, San Francisco, president of the league, predicted in a statement made public today.

"The cry of 'play ball' will mark the commencement of the greatest pennant race in minor league history, under the auspices of the most progressive league in the country, and I do not except the major leagues in this statement," Mr. McCarthy said.

"Most progressive, I repeat, because in every forward-looking movement for the betterment, protection and improvement of the national game, this league has pioneered the way.

"The purse of twenty thousand dollars offered by the directors is the latest earnest of our intention to secure the continued, sustained and best effort of every player from the commencement to the close of the season.

"Teams have been strengthened, the country has been combed to fill up weak spots with better players, parks have been enlarged and improved and no expense has been spared to give the best to our people.
