Candidates are quite numerous at this time.

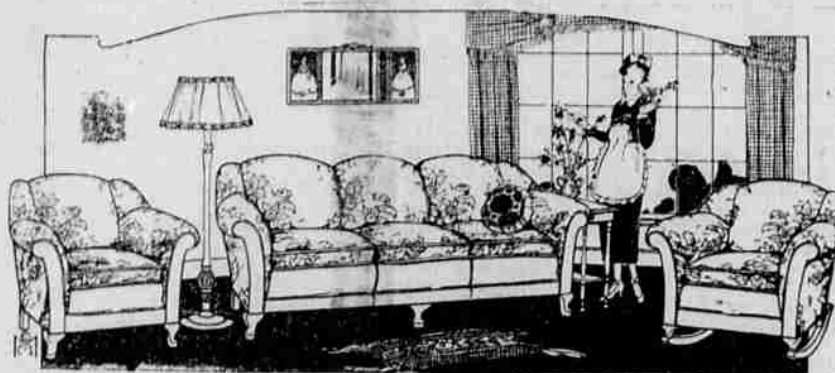

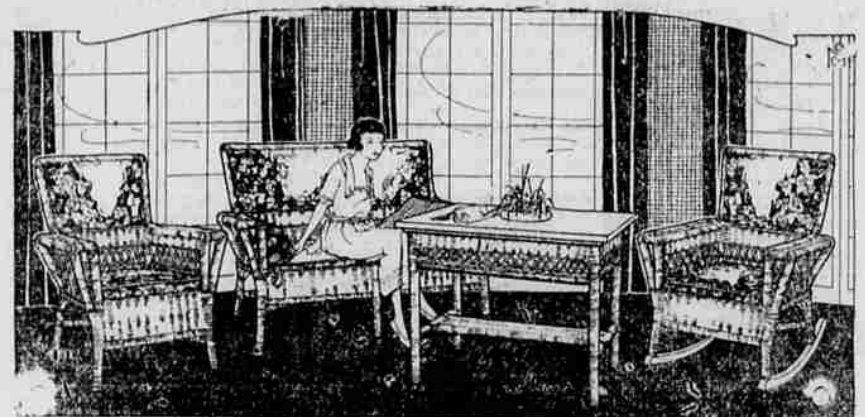

PARIS, Apr. 7.—A 1-cent British Guiana stamp, issue of 1856, black on carmine, sold today for 300,000 francs at the auction sale of the famous Baron Ferrari collection.

This price, plus the state tax, making a total of 352,500 francs, was the highest price ever paid for a stamp in France. The specimen was sold to a collector, an American.
