PROSPECTS ARE BRIGHTER NOW

SPOKANE, Wash., Apr. 8. — Prospects for the ultimate passage of the Towner-Sterling bill have never been brighter than now, Miss Charl Ormond Williams, president of the National Education association said in an address before the Inland Empire Education association tonight.

"This measure would create a federal department of education and provide aid in the states for the improvement of certain phases of education which are essential to good citizenship in both state and nation," she said. "If the bill could be brought to a vote today, I firmly believe it would receive large majorities in both houses."

"If the bill does not pass this congress public sentiment has become so strong that it will become an important factor in the political campaigns in the various districts at the next election. The women of the nation have been working for a department of education for more than a generation. They are unitedly and enthusiastically backing this measure and intend to continue

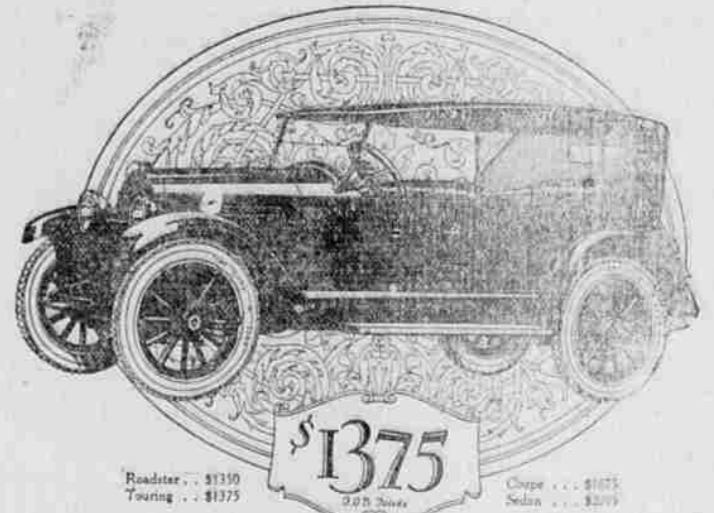
