**Shorter Days Not Wanted in France**

(By Associated Press) PARIS, Apr. 10.—Town and country are warring in France to determine whether daylight-saving time shall be used here next summer.

Summer time has proved unpopular to the townsman that the decision of the members of the senate to suppress it has raised a storm of protest, and every effort is being made to bring pressure to bear on the chamber of deputies to reverse the decision of the upper house.

Leading newspapers are taking part in the campaign for summer time. They contend that the great interest taken in athletic sports of all kinds during the last three years is due almost entirely to this measure, which enables the worker in the office or the factory to get exercise in the open air after his day's labor.

L'Auto, a daily newspaper devoted to athletics, is calling upon its readers to flood their representatives in parliament with petitions for the maintenance of summer time.

In the country, however, summer time seems to have proved distasteful, and farmers and land laborers are just as obstinate in their determination to suppress it. Representing a large part of the electorate, they also bring pressure to bear on their members of parliament. Each day argument grows hotter and hotter. Versailles Treaty, Washington, Genoa, reparations are often secondary to the great controversy, summer time or no summer time.

**MODEL'S LIFE IS NO SNAP**

(By Associated Press) CHICAGO, Apr. 10.—Lots of work and no play is the life of the present day artist's model, says a bulletin issued by the Art Institute here. The glamorous that fiction throws about a model is not duplicated in real life, according to the Institute's bulletin, which adds:

"To be a good model, one need not of necessity be beautiful. For students who are learning anatomy or structure of the face, the bones should be prominent and no willowy curves are desired. For advanced modeling classes beautiful curves are sought, and the head and face should have a fine contour. For classes in painting coloring is essential rather than form.

"The impression that models are of the frivolous type is not always well founded. Frivolity is not consistent with so exacting a profession. And it is hard work, too. Even the pleasure of seeing one's own face or figure on canvas cannot remove the ache from one's joints.

"Posing usually brings anywhere up to \$1 an hour, but most models cannot pose for more than five or six hours a day and only half of that time can be spent in a standing position, the bulletin adds.

**Soviets Imprison Socialists in Russia**

(By Associated Press) STOCKHOLM, Apr. 10.—The Social Democratic party of Sweden, of which Premier Branting is the head, has sent to the soviet government of Russia an indignant protest against the imprisonment of 5,000 socialists in Georgia and Russia.

The working class of Sweden has received reports regarding the treatment by the soviet government of Russia and Georgia socialists which have aroused indignation and anger. Over 200 Russian socialists of different persuasions have been forced to resort to hunger strike in order to call the world's attention to the sufferings to which they are exposed and in order to obtain forcibly an improvement of their conditions.

Five thousand Georgian social democrats are now in prison on account of their not having voluntarily submitted to the force of Russian expropriation. Others are deported by thousands or are forced to keep in hiding in order to escape the fate of those already arrested.
