LIPTON CUP RACE IN JULY

SEATTLE, Wash., Apr. 11.—The Lipton Cup race for Class R. Sloops, to be contested by the Sir Tom, of Seattle, and the Patricia, entry of

the Vancouver, B. C., yacht club, will be the principal feature of the Pacific International Yachting association's annual regatta to be held on Lake Washington here July 24 to 31. Sir Tom won the cup last year in British Columbia waters. While the original plan was to hold the races for the Isherwood trophy, emblematic of the Pacific coast championship for Class R. sloops, on Labor Day, officials of the association have announced that

If enough entries are received from California clubs, the Isherwood race may also be held in connection with the July regatta. There will be the usual schooner, yawl and other races during the regatta, and officials expect a number of entries from California and Oregon as well as Washington and British Columbia clubs. The meet will be the first to be held here for several years, and plans are being made to make it one of the greatest affairs of its kind to be staged on the Pacific coast. The full list of events, with conditions of the various races, is expected to be published shortly.
