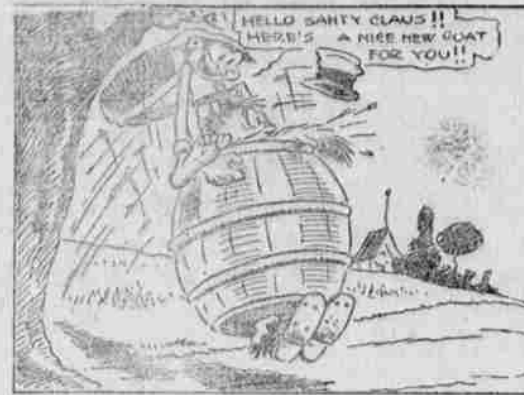


SLIM JIM AND THE FORCE
