YALE TEACHER IS HONORED

Japanese Erect Monument in Honor of Professor Geo. Ladd; Had Lectured in Japan.

(By Associated Press) TOKIO, Apr. 18.—Attended by more than a hundred prominent persons, a monument to the memory of Professor George Trumbull Ladd, late of Yale University, was unveiled on March 11, in the grounds of Seiji Temple, near Yokohama, where his ashes were recently buried. Among those witnessing or participating in the ceremony were the American ambassador, Prince Tokugawa, president of the House of Peers and delegate to the Washington Conference, Viscount Makino, minister of Imperial Household, Admiral Urabe, Baron Kuki, Mayor Goto, Viscount Fukuroka, Baron Yamakawa and professors Kuwaki, Shizawa and Aemaki of the Tokio Imperial University. When the monument was unveiled by Mrs. Ladd, Mr. Okubo, Mr. Warren, Viscount Makino and Prince Tokugawa spoke in high praise of the late Professor Ladd.

Mrs. Ladd concluded the ceremony with an expression of gratitude for the sentiment expressed in behalf of her late husband. Professor Ladd, who was regarded as one of America's great geologists, died in Noh Haven last summer at the age of 80 years. He had visited Japan three times and gave a number of lectures in educational psychology at different universities. When he received an audience by the late Emperor Meiji he was decorated with the order of the Rising Sun. In accordance with
