COLD LIGHT IS
DISCOVERED

PRINCETON, N. J., Apr. 25.—Professor E. Newton Harvey, after eight years of experimental work with luminous bodied insects, has discovered the means through which cold light may be produced. It was announced Friday at Princeton university.

A form of light giving a continuous glow, like that in bodies of the insects, has been developed by the professor. He is making an effort to intensify and perfect the light so that it will be of practical use.

BUILDING BOOM
HAS ARRIVED

The building boom is not coming. It is here so far the cities and large towns are concerned, according to the American Lumberman, of Chicago. The increase in building and the incessant demand for estimates have both played a part in stimulating buying and in firming up the lumber market generally. The building boom has not yet extended into the country districts, but the farmers are purchasing more material than previously and are carrying on much deferred repair work. Farmers in general are much encouraged over the outlook. Some sections have had too much rain but others, notably the southwest, have been assured good crops by the first good rains for several years.

Production of southern hardwoods has been very seriously interfered with by floods and general high water, and it is feared that a good many logs have been lost. Industrial demand for hardwoods is picking up and as production is at low ebb, particularly in the south, and comparatively little unsold dry hardwood lumber is available, a firmer tendency is to be noted.

Industrial purchasers generally are showing more interest in securing lumber. The coal strike is slowing down some railroads but in other cases it is having the curious effect of stimulating railroad buying. This is explained by the fact that with lessened traffic it is cheaper to make repairs and additions, and consequently some railroads which are in good financial condition are improving the opportunity to make needed repairs and extensions. In addition, there are a number of inquiries out for freight cars and there was recently placed by one railroad system an order for 16,000 freight cars, the largest single order placed during the last five years.

Duluth Man Wants To
Try for Championship

DULUTH, Minn., Apr. 25.—Rain or shine, Walter Hoover of the Duluth Boat Club, amateur singles sculling champion of North America, challenger for the world's sculling title daily propels his work boat over the ice clogged course in Superior bay and in the neighboring waters of Lake Superior in preparation for his season's program, principally for the English Henley races for which he recently made application.

Hoover's application was forwarded by the rowing committee of the U. S. C. and if his entry is accepted he will leave for London June 15. The English Henley races will be rowed over the Thames river course in London, June 30.

SABOTAGE IS
DISCOVERED

LEESBURG, Fla., Apr. 25.—What is believed to be an example of sabotage practical by enemies of this country during the World war has come to light here. A concern in the north manufacturing bolts and castings for the government had a large quantity of material left at the time of the armistice and a corporation constructing a factory here purchased several thousands of the bolts. They appeared to be perfect until mechanics attempted to use them. Then it was discovered that many had been sawed almost to the center from both sides at the threaded end, leaving a bare eighth of an inch of metal intact. The nuts on the damaged bolts had been screwed down to a point where they concealed the cuts.

Had the bolts been sent abroad they would have been useless for the purpose for which they were designed.
