Recuperating Resort Planned By Legion

NEW YORK, Apr. 25—High up in the Adirondacks, on the shores of Big Lake Tupper, the American Legion has bought a 1,200 acre camp which will be available as a recuperating resort for all men and women of New York state who were wounded during the world war or who have become sick by reason of their service. Title to motor boats, individual camping shacks and other outdoor equipment has also passed into the Legion's hands.

State lands in excess of 12,000 acres are made available for the camp's use by an order issued by Gov. Miller. This region is part of the New York State Preserve and the Legion's purchase adjoins. The time honored "lean-to" abounds in both districts and it is in these honest-to-goodness health producers that many grazed and wounded victims of the war are expected to literally get back on their feet.
