HENNA DYED BODIES IS FAD

Ultra-Society Women Deem Olive Colored Skin The Thing Now.

LONDON, Apr. 25.—A henna bath cult is forming among London's more ultra-society women, who deem olive-colored skin somewhat worth acquiring.

Glaze is said to be French or American origin. Baths, strongly tinted with henna dye, are taken monthly, and impart a delicate tint which looks well with the evening dresses of Oriental shades and design, now popular here.

Amusingly is declared to be easier than treating only that considerable portion of the body exposed by modern evening gowns.

Brilliant Meteor Is Observed on Sunday

LOS ANGELES, Cal., Apr. 25.—A meteor of unusual size and brilliance darted across the sky west of Los Angeles Sunday night.

Observers at the Mount Wilson observatory, about 20 miles north of here, said that the meteor was 15 or 20 times as brilliant as the planet Venus. From their perch high up on the mountainside the meteor was seen to break at an apparently short distance from the earth and its flaming mass was dissipated in the air.

The body was followed by a flaming tail of blue and green shades, which spread out like a fan for a considerable distance.

KLAN AGAIN MAKES DENIAL

Officials Declare Warning Supposedly Coming from Ku Klux Klan Not From Them.

SPOKANE, Wash., Apr. 25.—An announcement was made Monday of the death late Sunday night of Edwin P. Botts, a member of a superior court jury which recently acquitted Maurice Codd of the murder of Frank Brinton, a United States army soldier, under what the family characterizes as suspicious circumstances.

The family physician, who ascribed the death to heart failure, said he would perform an autopsy Tuesday to determine whether or not it may have been caused by poison. The son of the dead man, Fred Botts, said Monday he believed poisoning was the cause.

Botts said his father had been worried over several warnings he had received since the jury's discharge, purporting to have been sent by the Ku Klux Klan. Officials of the organization Monday denied they were responsible for warnings received by Botts or any other member of the jury.

EXERCISE FOR SOWS OF BIG IMPORTANCE

Necessary to Use Good Judgment in Management.

Corn Alone Is Very Poor Feed for Pregnant Animals Because It Lacks in Essential Protein and Mineral Matter.

E. F. Ferrin, in charge of swine production at University Farm, St. Paul, Minn., believes that good judgment in the care and handling of brood sows during the winter is as necessary as good feed in making a success with the pig crop.

"The cheapest grain for brood sows," he says, "is corn, but this feed alone is a very poor one for pregnant sows or gilts. Corn lacks in protein and mineral matter, each of which is essential if strong pigs are to be produced. Gilts will supplement corn fairly well, and a ration of two-thirds corn and one-third oats is reasonably good. One of the best feeds to be used with corn is wheat meal or tankage, the proportion of one part to nine or ten of corn. Alfalfa or clover hay is an

excellent addition to the corn ration, and will reduce the cost of the winter's feed if used.

"Amounts of feed to be given can well be governed by the gains made by the sows. Yearling, or older sows, need not gain more than a half pound daily during pregnancy, unless they are very thin in the fall. Gilts have growth to make as well as litter to produce, and consequently should increase more in weight than mature sows; from one-half to three-fourths of a pound is a reasonable amount.

"Exercise is one of the important factors in producing strong pigs. When the sow is not too deep, it is a good plan to feed her corn some distance from the house or shed so that the sows will have to exercise to get their feed. It is probable that exercise is a big factor in avoiding hairless pigs."

PROPER SIZE OF CONTAINERS

Dissatisfaction Caused by Use of Receptacles Not Sufficiently Strong Enough.

Much dissatisfaction with direct marketing has been caused by using containers that were not sufficiently strong. That is especially true when containers are used more than once, says the United States Department of Agriculture. Shipping containers should be light in weight but sufficiently durable to carry the produce safely.

The proper size of a container depends upon the desires of the customer. Most persons wish to obtain small quantities of each product at a time. Containers should be just large enough for the produce shipped. If the carton is too large or too small, both the produce and the container are likely to be damaged, for the produce will not be kept in place, and the container will be crushed.

The larger the quantity of produce shipped in one parcel the lower will be the cost per pound for transportation, and the lower the container cost per pound.

PREPARE GARDEN SOIL EARLY

"Planting Over" May Be Necessary Sometimes, but Labor Is Always Well Rewarded.

An early beginning in preparing the land and planting gardens is of much importance. Regardless of the season, it is well to get an early start. That "planting over" may sometimes be necessary cannot be denied. But little is lost when garden land must be planted over, for the labor necessary to prepare the land is always well-employed. Much is lost if early maturing vegetables are planted too late. Get your garden land ready and plant on time.

BE CAREFUL WITH LANTERNS

Little Flickering Flame Has It in Its Power to Destroy Anything of Inflammable Character.

These are the days of lanterns in the barn night and morning. It is well to remember that this little flickering flame has in it the power to destroy your home and all you have brought together in a lifetime. So never set it down in the barn, but hang it up securely. A wire running the length of the barn with a common house lamp on it, makes a safe hold. In fact, still, is an electric light equivalent.

Handling and Oiling. There is a lot of difference between the oiling of a machine and the oiling of a person. The oiling of a machine is done with a brush and the oiling of a person is done with a bottle. It is a good idea to have a bottle of oil handy at all times.

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FIGHT SNOWS TO SAVE LIFE

ENTERPRISE, Apr. 25.—W. J. Knight and G. W. Fenton, Enterprise youths, trapped 17 miles to Elk Flat through deep snow, and back again, taking provisions to Mrs. James Snyder, whose husband, a trapper, is ill here. Snyder, who had been planting trees for Ray Knight of Eden and, unable to reach his mountain home on scheduled time, feared for the safety of his wife.

Knight and Fenton carried 25 pounds of provisions each to the Snyder home. They found Mrs. Snyder well. They were forced to tramp much of the way as fresh snow made sliding difficult.

The snow on Elk Flat was between five and six feet deep, the altitude being 5000 feet. On Round meadow, at 4500 feet altitude, the snow was 29 inches deep, and at the ranger station it averaged two feet on the level.

TAKE OFFERING BY RADIO PHONE

(By Associated Press). OAKLAND, Cal., Apr. 25.—Rock Ridge radio station Sunday broadcasted a complete church service, sermon, choir music and offertory, to an audience estimated at 50,000 persons. It is believed this is the first complete service the air has carried. This service was conducted in the music room of the radio station by the Rev. Lloyd C. Sweetman, pastor of the St. Andrews Methodist church of San Francisco, and a male choir of three voices.

It was received at St. Andrews church in San Francisco and given to the congregation by a loud speaking receiving device and was also heard by fraternal homes, hospitals, fire and police stations equipped with radio receiving sets, as well as many private amateur stations. Although the col-

lection was taken only at the church, while the other carried a piano offertory solo, after the service telephone calls to the sending stations stated that members of the far-flung congregation were mailing their offerings to St. Andrews.
