

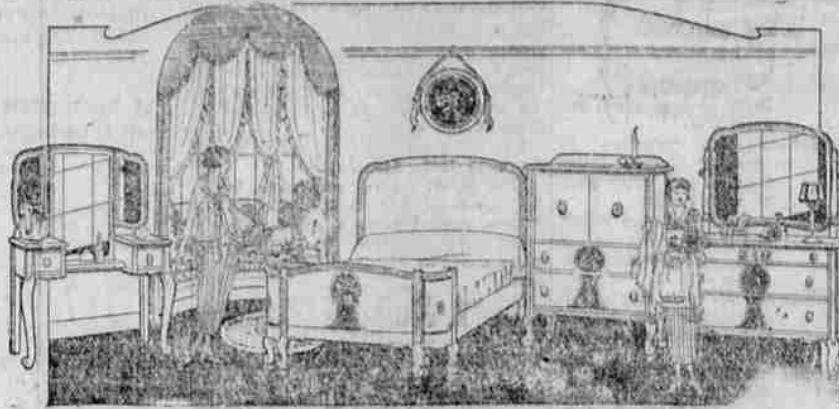

PROPAGANDA IS DISSEMINATED

(By Associated Press)
LONDON, Apr. 26.—English palates, long noted for their appreciation of fine old wines, are in danger of deterioration because of the lower price of vintages, according to a group of prominent wine merchants who propose an English "wine week" in emulation of the French custom. Wine, they declare, is no longer a luxury as the lower price has brought it within reach of all.
The purpose of wine week, it is said, will be to educate the English taste for wines and also to instruct diners in the elementary rules and traditional usages of beverage selections. It is planned to gather a representative group of speakers and writers to sing the praises of wine, and to tell those who would learn how to drink it. The merchants expect substantial assistance from the governments of wine producing countries, such as France, Italy, Spain and Australia.

TOTEM POLE TO BE EXPLAINED

CHICAGO, Apr. 26.—What the totem pole means in Indian history and legend will be made clearer to the school children of the country when films soon to be made by the Society of Visual Education are thrown on the screen.
Early this summer on those far off islands lying along the upper

coast of British Columbia, hundreds of Indians will take part in the unfolding of the legend surrounding the totem poles which travelers see in the Alaskan villages. This work will be under the direction of Prof. F. E. Froese, who for 40 years has made his home among the Indians on Queen Charlotte and Prince of Wales Islands. The services of Prof. Froese were obtained by H. L. Clarke, vice president of the Society for Visual Education, as the man best fitted to carry out this important plan.
Every part in the drama will be taken by Indians and drilling them for the ambitious work will begin in a few weeks under Prof. Froese's instruction. Two films have been arranged for and they will be produced purely from an educational standpoint for use in the public schools. While pictures have been made of the totem poles and of some of the Indians of that stormy region, it is believed this is the first attempt to put the meaning of the symbols into form understandable to the children. It is expected that both films will be ready for use by the opening of the schools in the fall.

PUNISHMENT FOR MARRIAGE

PARIS, Apr. 26.—A woman's attempt to punish her daughter-in-law for marrying again after her husband's death in the war has just been exposed here.
An elderly woman in Touraine informed the Ministry of War that she had recognized her son in one of six photographs published by the newspapers of insane soldiers, former prisoners of war in Germany returned after the armistice in a complete state of amnesia, unaware of their identity.
The wife of the missing soldier, having long ago given up her husband as dead, had just been married a second time and in the midst of her new honeymoon she was instructed to come to Paris and identify her first husband.

Greatly perturbed, she visited the hospital accompanied by her mother-in-law, who greeted "her son" effusively.
"That is not my husband," shouted the young woman and acquaintances of the missing soldier summoned also failed to recognize him, some of them even saying that there was not the slightest resemblance.
The older woman broke down and told the officials:
"I've known right along he wasn't my son but I wanted to teach his wife a lesson, she had no business getting married again!"

EXPORTS WERE OVER MILLION

MOSCOW, Apr. 26.—Russian exports for January this year amounted to \$1,250,000, according to recent announcement, the goods being made up chiefly of oil products, flax, hemp and furs. The shipments went mostly to England, Latvia and Estonia, a small part being sent to America.
The imports of Russia for January amounted to \$8,710 tons, valued at \$11,400,000, this being exclusively of the food taken into the country by the several relief organizations.
The imports show an increase of nearly six times as compared with January, 1921. The bulk of the imports came from Germany with England next, then Latvia, the United States and Estonia in the order named.
