MUCH FOODSTUFF IS DISTRIBUTED

LONDON, Apr. 26.—Walter Lyman Brown, Director for Europe of the American Relief Administration has announced that between March 1 and March 26 the distribution of American foodstuffs from the Russian ports amounted to 132,220 tons. This brought the grand total arrived in or moving toward the Volga Valley up to 168,273 tons. The average for the 26 days of March was 5,985 tons daily. The total arrivals in Black Sea ports at that time amounted to 282,052 tons, of which 155,032 were corn cargoes. Of the amount moved into the interior 8,018 tons have arrived in Tzaritzin; 1,385 tons are being distributed in Samara and 3,350 in Ufa. The adult corn ration is also being issued in Kazan, Simbirsk, Saratov and Orenburg.
