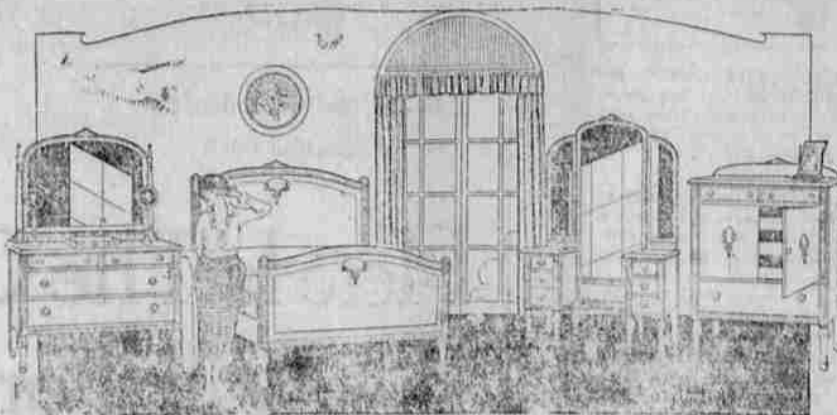

## RIVALRY FOR SEA COMMERCE

(By Associated Press)  
PRAGUE, Apr. 27.—Keen rivalry for predominance in the Danube shipping is developing among the three-land-locked fragments of the seismembered Hapsburg Empire—Austria, Czechoslovakia and Hungary. The Danube river is their sea, and port facilities mean traffic and national income. Hence one form of their competition is to build up their respective ports—Vienna, Pressburg (now called Bratislava) and Budapest, situated close to each other on a bend of the river.

With the prospect of a connecting canal system between the Danube and the Rhine through Bavarian enterprise, the Danube is coming to be regarded here as the greatest artery of trade in Europe of tomorrow and the British were aware of this when they founded their River Syndicate.

The first struggle between the three ports was to get the Allies' Danube Commission, Bratislava won but the term was fixed for five years and the commission will next go where the biggest traffic is. This is spurring the Czechs to increase the traffic capacity of Bratislava to 1,000,000 tons this year and ultimate plans call for a capacity for 3,000,000 tons.

The struggle for trade thus far is mostly between Bratislava and Budapest with Vienna lagging. Hungary has granted a contract to a French firm to construct a first-class port at Budapest and the Czechs are preparing to answer this by equipping Bratislava at a cost to the government of 225,000,000 Czech crowns. Czechoslovakia also proposes to build a subsidiary port at Komarno. This work is to be completed in three years.

A private company has been organized to take over the shipping under the Czech flag on the Danube and Czechoslovakia meets to keep the Danube commission at Bratislava.

## DUST CLOUDS ARE CONQUERED

MEXICO CITY, Apr. 27.—After years of experimenting in an effort to stop the dense clouds of dust which sweep down on Mexico City at certain regular periods, the Department of Agriculture has decided to plant clover and alfalfa in the bed of Lake Texcoco, a lake near

the capital which has been dry for several years.  
Agricultural experts believed well cultivated verdure will invite moisture in greater quantities and will prevent the dust from rising in the driest seasons.

## DEPRECIATION HARD ON RICH

MOSCOW, Apr. 27.—Many of the millions of persons hitherto fed by the government and who are now being thrown upon their own resources are finding life in Russia, complicated by depreciation in the value of the paper ruble, growing constantly more difficult.  
Only 6,000 persons including the

Red army and navy are now receiving government rations, says the Moscow Pravda. Last September the number was 11,500,000.

Factory workmen, government employes and others cut off the free ration list receive, in theory, pay increases supposed to be adequate to permit them to buy their food on the open markets. The pay fixed today, however, may be worth actually, in purchasing power, only half as much next week, or next month.

Prices for food and other articles in Moscow follow almost exactly the depreciating value of the ruble as compared to gold or foreign money. If street brokers pay 250,000 rubles to the dollar today and 1,000,000 for the dollar a week or so hence, bread will cost four times as much a week hence.

A salary of 2,000,000 rubles monthly, fixed a month ago, has little purchasing power today with street car fares fixed at 32,000 ru-

bles, newspapers 5.00 rubles each and black bread 50,000 rubles a pound.

How Russians manage to exist through all these difficulties is a puzzle to the foreigner; yet Moscow's population does not appear to be greatly underfed.

Housewives perhaps tear their hair when they find that varying market prices disrupt their household budgets. A chicken, say, that was quoted yesterday at 600,000 rubles, may cost 1,000,000 today but many Muscovites manage to get the additional slice of paper called money and buy the chicken just the same.
