

## GUN CLUB HOLDS ANNUAL MEETING

WALLOWA, May 2.—The Wallowa Rod and Gun club held its regular monthly meeting at the city council room last Thursday evening. New officers were elected for the coming year and considerable other business was transacted. The new officers are: Jay Billings, president; Cal Larn, vice-president; George Rogers, secretary; and Dick Maxwell, treasurer. The report of the secretary-treasurer was read and accepted. The treasurer reported considerable money due the club from members who have been shooting blue rocks at the traps and have neglected paying for the same. This will be collected at once and the club placed on a sound financial basis once more. The club plans to resume shooting on the rifle range and also trapshooting at once and keep in practice to meet any challenge that may come up for a contest. The Wallowa trapshooters have been the champions of Eastern Oregon for a number of years and have no intention of surrendering the title for a long time yet. The secretary is corresponding with the breeders of wild turkeys and the club plans to introduce these birds in the Wallowa valley during the coming summer.

## AUTO CAMP IS NOW PROJECTED

WALLOWA, May 2.—At the Commercial association meeting Tuesday evening the subject of auto camp grounds was discussed. It was the consensus of opinion that a suitable place should be procured. J. O. Kildie told of inquiries which he had from the State Auto Tourist association asking him for information on the subject. It was recognized that tourists bring in money and take away a good impression in proportion to the treatment which they receive. It was thought feasible to offer to the tourist the choice of several sites which fit their requirements. A camp is already available at the Pole Bridge up Bear creek, which would take the visitors into the heart of some of our best scenery. The site of the old Bear creek sawmill could possibly be made available, and several nearby spots could be fixed at a small expense to furnish the campers a place to build a fire and get water. The city park was suggested as a site, and its possibilities are to be investigated. Part of the city dump ground is available, as is also a site across from the Forest office near the river. Sign boards are planned to direct the visitors to available places.

## GRANGE OPPOSES COUNTY FAIRS

The Union county Pomona grange held its regular meeting with Mt. Fannie Grange of Cove April 29. The grange strongly favored strict economy in all county and state affairs and adopted resolutions favoring the discontinuing of the county fairs until the tax situation is better adjusted and to start the matter right have decided not to ask for county help for the grange fair, but to hold community fairs this year at the various subordinate granges. Wolf Creek and Blue Mt. already have their fair under way. The grange also adopted resolutions favoring the retaining of the millage system for supporting the state schools. ## HELENIC CLUB TWO YEARS OLD

SPOKANE, Wash., May 2.—Two years of Americanization and educational work have been completed by the Hellenic club of Spokane, a local organization of over 100 Greek-born men. Good fellowship, education, and Americanization were named as objectives of the club when it was formed slightly over 24 months ago, and since, officers and members have labored unceasingly to reach them. Special night classes, meeting twice a week during the past winter, have been a feature of the club's activities. Civics and elementary English were taught to a class of 29 by a teacher loaned by the Spokane city schools. The average class attendance was 25. Twenty members of the club are naturalized citizens. "First papers" are prerequisite to membership. Among other things, the club has sponsored community gatherings, both patriotic and social, and has a visiting committee for the sick. A number of prominent Spokane men are honorary members of the club.

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## NEW CLASS OF WHEAT URGED

SPOKANE, Wash., May 2.—Placing of all varieties of white wheat into one class to be known as "white wheat," by the United States department of agriculture, will save several thousand dollars for white wheat growers in Pacific states, according to Walter J. Robinson, secretary of the Washington-Idaho Wheat Growers' association. The consolidation will become effective June 17, in time for this 1922 crop. Alterations have also been made in the standards of red wall wheat, which will hereafter be called "western red." "Consolidation of white wheat into one class is an important action for the western farmer," said Mr. Robinson. "It means thousands of dollars more to the producer of white wheat who heretofore has been penalized for mixtures greatly beyond the actual loss in the value of the grain. This change leads to the elimination of unjust and exorbitant penalties levied against mixtures of common white club varieties which obtained under the old plan of dividing white wheats into two classes."
