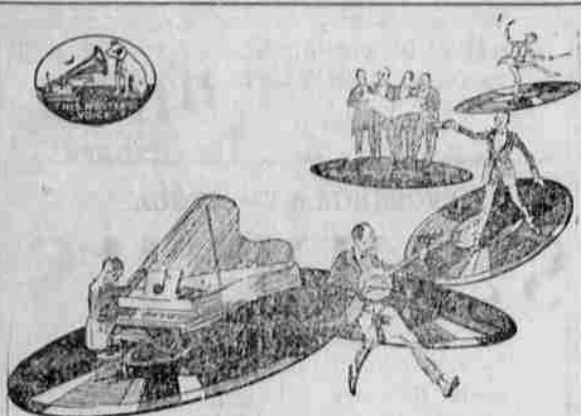

BOY SCOUTS RUN CITY ONE DAY

Twin Falls, Ida. Lads Take Every Office From Mayor to Dog Catcher and Cop.

TWIN FALLS, Ida., May 2.—For one whole Saturday, Boy Scouts ran the city of Twin Falls, every office from mayor to dog-catcher being turned over to them. Scouts were elected to the different offices by their fellows, each having a municipal job for the day.

The election was held following a banquet Thursday evening, served by members of the Rotary and Kiwanis clubs for members of the Boy Scout troops of Twin Falls, their scoutmasters and fathers. About 150 scouts were present, and 122 votes were cast.

The successful candidates were inducted into office Friday evening, when Mayor P. W. McElberts turned over the city keys to the boys, following ceremonies of investiture by Oscar Kirkham, chief scout executive of the state of Utah. Saturday the 23 elected officers and 122 other scouts took charge of the city, serving as members of the police, fire, sanitation, and street and water department forces.

Thirty scout policemen received preliminary instructions from Chief of Police Ben J. Brown, then were assigned by their own chiefs to patrols and other duty. Several arrests of adults for violations of traffic regulations were made. One scout, elected to a municipal office, was taken before the scout police judge on a charge of being under age and driving a car.

Thorough inspection of the entire city from a sanitation standpoint was made by 65 scouts, and detailed reports made to the regular sanitation officer. Seventeen scouts were on duty at the fire department, inspected the basements of the business district, made a "run" and otherwise familiarized themselves with the fire fighters' duties.

Scouts as understudies of city officials were given the fullest possible opportunity to learn about the work of the offices in which they served during the day. Oscar Kirkham expressed warm praise of the city's cooperation with the scouts in the undertaking.

ECONOMY BILLS ARE NOW LAW

PHOENIX, Ariz., May 2.—A saving of millions of dollars to the state of Arizona is expected to be one of the benefits resulting from a special session of the state legislature which closed recently. Governor Thomas E. Campbell had called the extraordinary session for the purpose of affording consideration of amendments to the constitution designed to increase efficiency and economy in the state government.

The final act of the legislature was to pass an appropriation bill providing funds to operate the state government for the year beginning next July 1. This supply bill calls for the expenditure of more than half a million dollars less than was provided by a previous appropriation measure covering the same period. The legislature also passed a financial code revealing 179 continuing appropriations and diverting all money into one general fund, providing that all money for state use shall come from that fund only as appropriated to the various

state departments by the legislature in the general appropriation bill.

Eight constitutional amendments were approved by the legislature and will be submitted to Arizona voters at the next state primary election.

Other legislation enacted concerned maintenance of the state educational system, centralization of administrative authority, revision of the state inheritance tax law, regulation of automobiles and the use of public highways, restoration of competitive bidding on street paving, and laws relating to irrigation, drainage and electrical districts.

Expenses of the special session, which lasted sixty days, amounted to \$70,000, most of which went toward salaries of members and attaches.

WASHINGTON, May 2.—Assistant Secretary Dover of the treasury, who is in charge of customs and internal revenue, will leave Washington May 10 for a tour of inspection of the revenue and customs offices in the southwest and on the Pacific coast, it was announced last night at the treasury.

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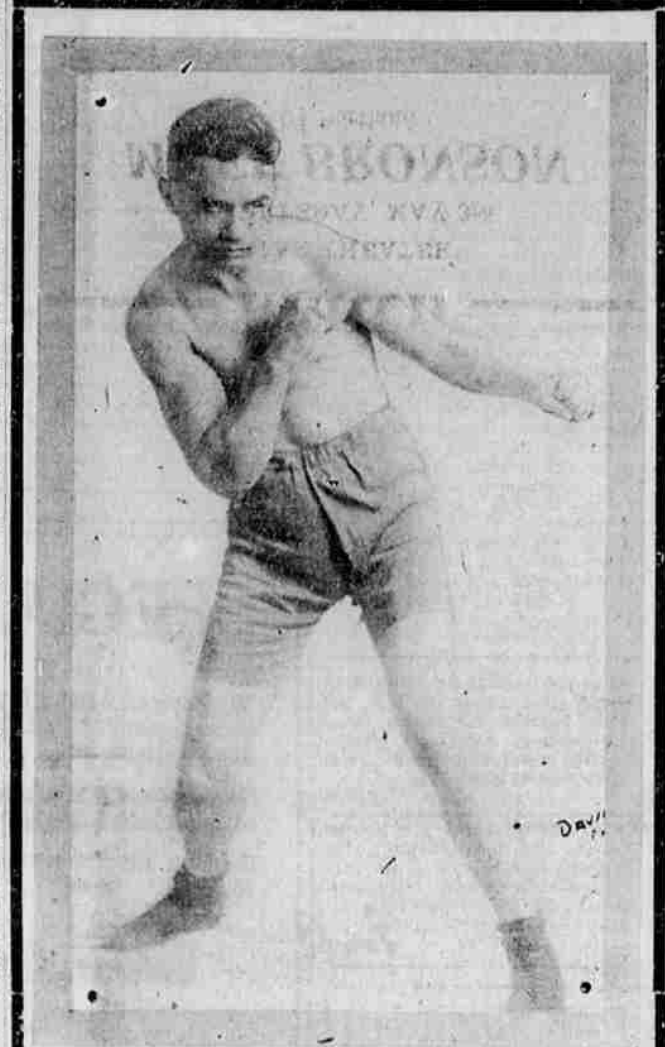
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BEND SEES AIRPLANE
