FANS WANT REID'S AUTO PICTURES.

The popularity of the automobile race Paramount pictures in which Wallace Reid has starred has resulted in the screening of "Too Much Speed," another original Byron Morgan story with the race track as a background.

SPECTACULAR FIRE ON MOUNTAIN TOP.

One of the most spectacular flashes in "Flower of the North," which will be shown at the Star Theatre Saturday and Sunday shows a lighted signal fire which Pauline Starke, as Jeanne, kindles to start a tribe of Indians on the warpath.

This fire was kindled on the highest peak of a range of mountains of Northern Oregon at midnight, and its flames shot hundreds of feet in the air and were visible for many miles. Ballot Title For Reorganization Bill Has Been Prepared

SALEM, May 5.—The ballot title for the proposed constitutional amendment, being initiated by the People's Power League of Oregon, has been prepared by Attorney General VanWinkle and is ready for circulation for signatures for a place on the November ballot.

Under the short title, as prepared by the attorney general, the proposed amendment will go before the voters as the "state government organization and proportionate occupational representation amendment."

Its purpose, as set forth by the attorney general, is "to reorganize state government, vesting chief control in a legislature of only one house, elected in proportion to registered voters' occupations with- out political designation; representatives to elect governor from their own members with power to recall him; district attorneys, sheriffs and other peace officers subject to governor's orders for law enforcement; any representatives elected by first, second and other classes by proportional representation method of single transferable vote; board created to make laws governing first election of representatives."

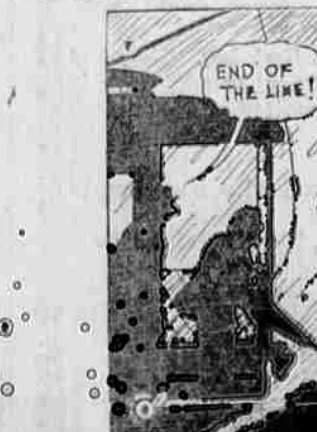
