COLLECTIONS RATHER SLOW

SAN JOSE, Cal., May 8—Henry B. Stewart, who on March 1, was given judgment for \$204,840.232, 912,665.47 against George Jones by Judge J. R. Welch in the superior court, has started proceedings to collect. Sheriff George W. Lyle located Jones in a local bank, which he attached. After Lyle had deducted his commission and expenses there remained \$19.69 left to apply on the original judgment. The judgment represents the amount due Stewart on a promissory note for \$100, executed by Jones over 20 years ago, calling for interest at 10 per cent compounded monthly, until the debt was paid.

MANY BOY SCOUT HEROES LISTED

Annual Report Shows That 541 Made Self-Sacrifices and Were Granted Medals.

In the past eleven years, 541 Boy Scouts have been awarded honor medals for risking their lives in self-sacrifice, usually successful, to save others, and 255 other scouts have received letters of commendation for similar actions with lesser peril. The year 1921 shows the highest number of awards of 479—total of 147

honor medals, three being of gold, sixty-four of silver and eighty of bronze. The scouts who thus have stepped into the ranks of heroes come from towns and cities all over the United States.

"On more than one occasion," states Dan Beard, famous author and outdoors man, in making his annual report as Chairman of the National Council of Boy Scouts of America at its annual meeting, March 29 and 30, at Chicago, "the short typewritten accounts of a tragedy have caused the eyes of more than one member of the Court to grow dim with moisture; yet that Court is composed of tough outdoor men hardened by years of exposure to danger of all kinds, men who themselves have often faced death with the grim courage of the American pioneer."

Mr. Beard states that the records show that scout preparedness for saving life is becoming yearly a more vital and significant feature of the movement. It is the practice of the Boy Scouts of America, in case the scout loses his life in an effort to save another, to award the honor medal to the mother or other nearest relative.
