

W. C. T. U. ENDED ITS CONFERENCE

Sessions During the Past Two Days Devoted to Discussions of Urgent Problems.

The Regional Conference of the W. C. T. U. opened Tuesday afternoon in the Baptist church with Mrs. Mary Mallett, state president, presiding. Mrs. G. H. Quigley conducted the opening devotional exercises with song and prayer and Scripture reading and a very earnest talk on some of the qualifications of a successful W. C. T. U. worker.

She was followed by Mrs. Ada Wallace Unruh, state campaign manager for the Children's Farm home, which the W. C. T. U. has undertaken to establish on a farm near Corvallis where they will have the aid of the various departments of the institution in training the children in actual successful farm methods. This is to be a real home for state orphans and dependent children divided into small groups under the care of motherly women with a very capable woman at the head of the home and a man of like experience to supervise the children in the work of the farm. Mrs. Unruh is especially in favor of every child having a home and a pet to love.

Mrs. Mary Mallett then led in a departmental conference, discussing "Christian Citizenship," "Law Enforcement," "Legislation," and "What Shall We Do With the Bootlegger?" Under the first head it was advised that it was the Christian citizen's duty to rally together to overthrow more than thirty organizations which have been formed solely to defeat the 18th amendment, and to keep ourselves informed along all lines of advancement and the various political party platforms—what they advocate and what they stand for.

She gave much information in regard to law enforcement and who can make arrests and advises the use of many leaflets and manuals on all the various departments of the work, especially on law enforcement. She read the liquor law and it was discussed quite at length, several delegates reporting their disappointing experiences in trying to have the law enforced in Union county, and in other counties, as well. At this time several candidates for nomination spoke to the Union of the policies they stand for, and what they hoped to do. These candidates were: C. R. Elberhard, A. R. Hunter and J. E. Reynolds, candidate for county treasurer of Union county.

In the evening there was a song service and prayer, followed by an address of welcome by Mrs. A. E. Ivanhoe, who spoke very earnestly and appreciatively of the work of the W. C. T. U., especially along the line of child welfare work, and protecting the youth of the land from the temptations that are being set before them.

Mrs. Mallett spoke again on Child Welfare work along the line of its needs as apparent to her in her thirteen months' service as a probation officer in Multnomah county. The things she brought before us and the ideas of the need of more being done in various lines was gratefully received. She showed what the W. C. T. U. has already done as a national or-

NEW APPARATUS AND DEVICES

A NON DISTORTING AMPLIFYING TRANSFORMER.

A great deal of the distortion experienced when using radio amplifiers for voice amplification in the past has been traced directly to the transformer.



Due to stray fields there has also been considerable trouble at times occasioned by "howling" when many audio-frequency stages were coupled together. The cure construction of the transformer illustrated is such that there is very little tendency for the setting up of stray magnetic fields. Both primary and secondary windings are wound upon a middle leg of the closed

iron core. The core is laminated. Stray magnetic fields are thus eliminated and the distributed capacity of the secondary winding is a low value.

The primary winding has a direct current resistance of 1.50 ohms and the resistance to alternating current is 1.00 ohm at 1,000 cycles. The resistance at 1,000 cycles is 60.00 ohms. For the secondary winding the direct current resistance is 5.50 ohms, resistance to alternating current is 1.00 ohm at 1,000 cycles and resistance to 10,000 cycles is 1.00 ohm.

This transformer is well designed mechanically and is very compact. It may be mounted in any position by means of the four feet, which have holes for the purpose. The binding posts are easily accessible and will take a large size wire. The iron core and the coil are finished in black and the hardware and binding posts are nickel plated.

NEW GOVERNOR TO BE NAMED

HAMILTON, Bermuda, May 11.—General Sir James Willcocks, the most decorated man in the British army, is to be succeeded as Governor of Bermuda by Lieutenant General Sir John Joseph Asper, advised received here today.

Sir James Willcocks has arranged to return to England by direct steamer leaving here June 2. The date of the arrival of the new Governor has not been determined.

Sir John Joseph Asper was born in 1867, entered the British army in 1887, was attached to the Nile Expedition in 1897-98, was present at the battles of Abbara and Khartoum and commanded the Sudan Expedition 1899. Although he had retired from the army when the world war began he rejoined and was placed as commander of an area. In 1901, Sir John Joseph Asper married Lella, daughter of Jas. Wetherspoon, of New York.
