Portable Grinder. A portable electric grinder for the machine shop, designed to be moved over the work, has the power of one-horse to one-half horsepower placed above the work out of the operator's way. The spindle is bored with a five-sixteenth-inch hole to receive an adjustable shaft for interior grinding and the use of interchangeable grinding wheels adapts the little machine to a wide range of work.
