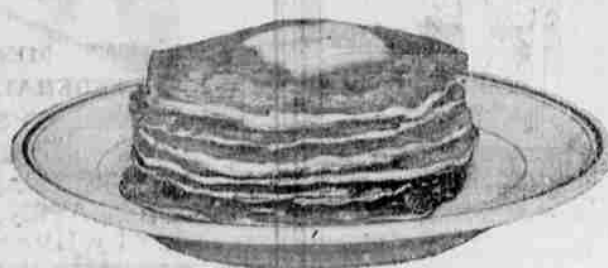

I keep everything, but that horrid expense account.
