

LA GRANDE IS WINNER AGAIN

Local Team Retains Lead in Intermountain Baseball League by 10 to 1 Victory.

La Grande retained her lead in the Intermountain League by defeating Haines at the fair grounds by the score of 10 to 1 Sunday. Twenty hits were piled up against the two Haines pitchers, Shields and Geddes. On the other hand, Melnis, pitching for La Grande, held the visitors to five hits, two of them being of the scratchy kind.

For the first three innings the game looked as if it would be a pitchers' battle throughout. Melnis faced just nine batters in the first three innings, fanning three of them. Shields, the Haines twirler, had a little difficulty in the first two innings but came out of the hole each time, in the third a sparkling double play sent La Grande down one, two and three.

In the fourth inning the La Grande sluggers got under way and every man on the team faced the Haines twirler in this frame. Five hits and four runs put the game on ice. Melnis helped win his game by hitting a long single that scored the first two men.

In the next inning another home town boy raced across the plate with another tally and in the sixth Shields was knocked out of the box. Four more runs were scored and Johnson was responsible for two of these with a homer that scored Hickey ahead of him. One more run in the seventh completed the La Grande counting for the day.

Haines' lone run came in the eighth when Fain, of Haines, reached first hitless. A long fly that was muffed by Theison allowed Fain to cross the plate. Until Haines' fumble the team had played errorless ball. In the first half of the ninth the Haines team attempted a rally but Melnis checked the feeble attempt by striking out Davidson, leaving Wells on second.

Crews, Theison, Johnson and Meserve were the hitting stars yesterday. After fanning the first time up, Bud poled out four husky singles in five times up to bat. Meserve found his batting eye also and got three hits. One of them was the only extra base hit of the day, a two bagger. Crews and Johnson each boosted their batting average by getting three safe hits out of five times up. Johnson made the second home run of the season for La Grande.

One of the features of the game was the splendid work of Knight at third base on the local team. He accepted every chance in sight and played errorless ball.

La Grande now has three straight wins with no losses. The critical game will come next Sunday when the locals journey to Cove in their second game. Cove is itching to revenge the defeat she received in the opener and also is La Grande's most dangerous rival for high honors.
