AT SHERRY'S LAST DAY OF "FINE FEATHERS."

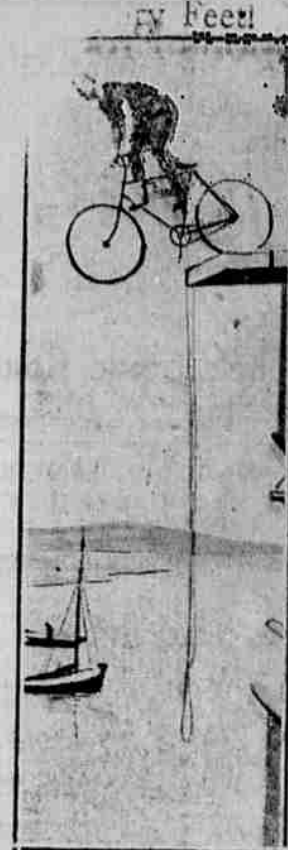
