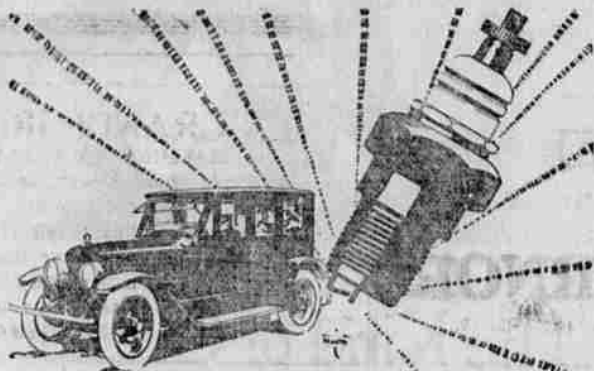
to La Grande Saturday morning to time to take the Shrine special train from there at 7 a. m.
