BAKER GOLFERS TO BE GUESTS

La Grande Country Club
Will Entertain Visitors
Here Next Sunday.

Arrangements for the entertainment of the group of golfers coming from Baker next Sunday have been made by the Board of Directors of the La Grande Country Club. During the present week the membership is putting the course in the best possible condition, last night especially having made a big showing. A big crowd was on the job. This will be continued nightly for the rest of the week.

The entertainment plans call for a dinner being served at the Country Club Sunday at \$1.00 per plate; 30 plates have been reserved for the Baker players and their wives and here are 40 or more plates available for local people. Reservations are necessary and should be in by Saturday morning, the Country Club being ready to receive such reservations at any time. The directors feel that at least 40 local plates should be reserved and as many more as care to, the only provision being that people who desire to take dinner at the Country Club should notify the club by Saturday morning.

La Grande is indebted to Baker Country Club for two very enjoyable informal tournaments held at Baker during the last eight months and the local golfers and club members are anxious to repay the courtesies shown them by the Baker people.

WILL TAKE TRIP ALONG THE TRAIL

Mr. and Mrs. Elmer Stoddard will leave early tomorrow morning to join the Eastern Oregon group that starts on Friday to have the highway between Oregon and Salt Lake marked as the Old Oregon Trail. At Baker, N. E. Meacham, president of the Old Oregon Trail association, and Sidney J. Vincent, manager of the Oregon Tourist Information Bureau, will make up another car, and Major Douglas of Ontario and a group of Boise people will make up the balance of the party. Brief stops will be made at Ontario, Weiser, Parma and Caldwell with a big meeting at Boise Friday night with the state officials. Saturday morning the party will go to Buhl and hold a night meeting at Twin Falls. On Sunday Pocatello will be the objective and in the afternoon a group of Pocatello people will escort the visitors to the remains of Old Fort Hall, where a big chicken dinner will be served. On Monday upon the Pocatello Chamber of Commerce will entertain the tourists and from there the tourists will go direct to Salt Lake and after their visit will return to Oregon. Mr. and Mrs. Stoddard will hurry back before the salt lake visit is complete.

"We consider ourselves very fortunate that Mr. Stoddard can make his trip as representative of the Union County Ad Club," declared C. S. Short, president of the club today.

The first of a series of four lectures by Rev. Wm. R. Reece of Portland was given Tuesday evening at the Neighborhood Club rooms, to a representative audience interested in the affirmative attitude toward the Bible. Mr. Reece gave an interesting account of the sixty-six books comprising the Bible written at various times during a period of one thousand six hundred years and all enforcing a single theme.
