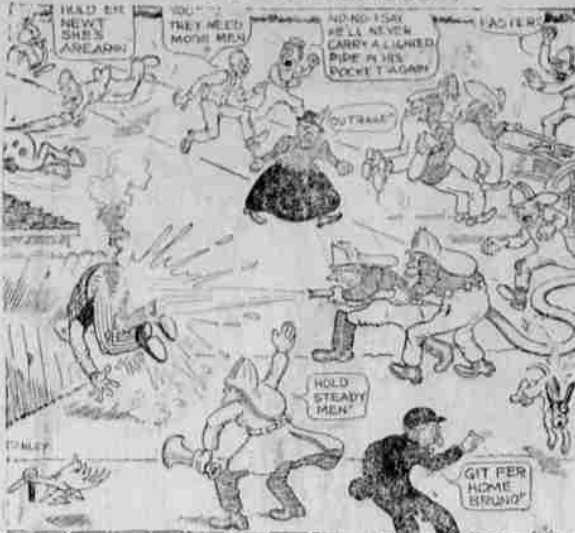


IN THE OLD HOME TOWN
