palaces of the Sheik, bazaars, bridges, streets and lanes, was built for the production and the exterior are almost as beautiful as the interiors. The harem and throne scenes, especially, are works of art, and the groupings of beautiful women, their costumes and the magnificence of their surroundings are starting in their exquisite allurements.

Ernst Lubitsch, the master director who produced "One Arabian Night," likewise plays the principal male role, that of a hunchback clown, head of a traveling troupe of players of which the dancer is the chief asset. The clown loves the dancing girl to distraction, and the suffering that he undergoes when she rejects him for a royal suitor forms one of the most tragic incidents of the play, and Lubitsch's interpretation of the part stamps him as one of the best screen players of this age.

Mrs. Blake's Favorite Recipe Devil's Food Cake.
