STATE EXAMS WELL HANDLED

Final Results on Union County Pupils Show a Good Average Passed in the Work.

While the first figures on the returns from the state examinations held in Union county showed the percentage small who passed, yet this has been in getting returns similar to the recent gubernatorial campaign, and the final showing is much better and in fact quite good. Of the 229 who took the examination, County Superintendent A. E. Ivanhoe reports 161 successful and of the entire 229 those failing only five per cent failed in one or two branches, each student having very good grades on other studies. In physiology 95 per cent of the entire number taking the examination passed. In geography 80 per cent passed and a number of districts had the enviable record of 100 per cent to the good on all work. "I consider the work done by the pupils very good indeed," said Mrs. Ivanhoe today. "I do not want the wrong impression to get out over the county that our young people have not made good, for they have and one has but to consult the figures above given to know that the work has been well done in Union county."

WALLOWA BOY GIVEN TROPHY

WALLOWA, May 29. — Ralph Couch, son of L. Couch of this city, was accorded the highest honors of his class at the University of Oregon Junior prom last Saturday evening. To Couch, who is junior student at the university, was awarded the Coyle cup, which is presented annually to the student considered the best all around man in his class. A similar trophy, the Gerlinger cup, is awarded to the girl deemed the best all around woman student. Ralph Couch is a graduate of the Wallowa high school, and it is considered an honor for the graduate of any school to win the trophy. Couch is a member of the student executive council at the university, and a major student in the school of business administration. The selection of junior man and junior woman is made.
