WALLOWA PIONEER PASSED ON LAST WEEK

WALLOWA, Oregon, May 31.—Another of the pioneers of this section passed away with the death of Daniel B. McKenzie Wednesday morning about eight o'clock. Mr. McKenzie was about 61 years of age, having come to the Grande Ronde valley from Indiana when three years of age. He was a farmer and freighter for years, coming to Wallowa in 1906. In 1919 he returned to Summerville, but in 1921 returned to Wallowa, where he died. He was father of eleven children, nine of whom survive him, and all of whom were present at the time of his death. He was buried at Summerville Thursday, Rev. Weston Shields of this city officiating.
