COMPETITION ON INSURANCE

La Grande and Pendleton Vets Will Contest for Largest Quota in Government Protection.

In co-operating with the United States Veterans' Bureau and other American Legion posts in Washington, Oregon and Idaho, the local American Legion Post No. 41 announces that they will take part in an intensive drive for reinstatement and conversion of war risk insurance during the week commencing June 12th and ending on June 17th. The plan as it has been proposed is to secure a total of \$5,000,000 in veterans' insurance in the northwest district.

The three towns in Eastern Oregon—Baker, La Grande and Pendleton—are each expected to raise \$100,000 apiece and the local legionnaires are confident that the amount can be raised in La Grande.

The local Legion post does not expect to go to a large expense in endeavoring to raise the amount but are entering heartily into the movement confidently expecting to go over the top with the set quota. The matter will be taken up before the members of the local post at the next regular meeting, scheduled for Monday, June 12, the opening day of the drive. A meeting of the county council will be held soon, the date not definitely decided upon as yet, and the matter will be laid before the joint representatives of the Union County American Legion posts.

"No insurance company offers the advantages that the War Risk Insurance offers to the ex-serviceman," states Dr. Ray Murphy, commander of the local post, "and it is to the soldier's advantage that he keeps his policy up." For particulars, the ex-servicemen are requested to communicate either with adjutant Lynn Bohkamp or Commander Dr. Ray Murphy.

SEATTLE, Wash., June 1.—For the purpose of having every ex-serviceman and woman in the Pacific Northwest protected by government insurance, an intensive drive for reinstatement and conversion of war risk insurance will be held in Oregon, Washington and Idaho under the direction of the United States Veterans' Bureau and

the American Legion, June 12th to 17th, inclusive. It was announced here today. It is proposed to secure a total of \$5,000,000 in veterans' insurance in the northwest district.

La Grande will compete with Pendleton in a contest to see which city can secure the largest amount of government insurance for its war veterans. The Veterans' Bureau has set a quota for each of the two cities in Eastern Oregon at \$100,000 a piece.

The state departments of the American Legion in Oregon, Washington and Idaho have endorsed the proposition of the drive and promise to work actively in securing the quotas assigned to the various cities and states of the Pacific Northwest, it was stated here. Norman W. Eagle of Seattle, northwest representative of the national organization of the Legion, has sent out communications to the various posts of Oregon, urging them to appoint committees for the purpose of pushing the drive in their respective communities. The quota set for the state of Oregon is \$2,000,000.

Extracts of Report of Examination

Made by Paul L. Woolston for the Insurance Department of Oregon of the Oregon Fire Relief Association as of December 31, 1921.

"Because of the financial strength of the association and the labor involved in obtaining market values as of December 31, 1921, the bonds have been allowed herein at the par or book value."

"The surplus to members is large, soundly invested, and is not greatly less than the entire liabilities. The admitted assets to liabilities is 180%, a very creditable showing. The association is performing a valuable service to its members and is believed to merit their whole-hearted support."
