ALFRED OWSLEY WILL GRADUATE

La Grande Boy Was Popular at O. A. C.; Selected Commercial Course.

OREGON AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE, Corvallis, June 2.—Alfred Owsley of La Grande will be graduated from the school of commerce of the college on June 5.

Mr. Owsley was active in college during his four years, as is shown by the fact that he is a member of Alpha Kappa Psi, the national honorary commerce fraternity, also of Beta Alpha Psi, the national honorary accounting fraternity which stands for high scholarship in accounting. In his senior year he was a member of the college directory staff.

On completion of his first two years of basic work in commerce, Mr. Owsley elected business administration for his major course of study. The business administration course is designed primarily to train the student for efficient business organization and management.

BALLASTING IS NEARING END

O-W Has Had 200 Men at Work on This Division Making Over Roadbed.

C. F. Roberts, assistant superintendent of the road division of the O-W, stated today that the ballasting which was commenced last season is being finished this summer, as part of the \$1,500,000 to be spent on this division in ballasting and re-railing, has been practically completed from La Grande to Baker.

The past week has found a crew of over a hundred men working in the block in front of the depot and with this crew completed only a small section this side of Baker, which is receiving its finishing touches, now remains incomplete.

The work has been carried on efficiently with a force of men numbering over two hundred and the ballasting from Union Junction to La Grande has been completed in a little over a month's time.

CAMPING TRIP IS AT AN END
