Meusel's First



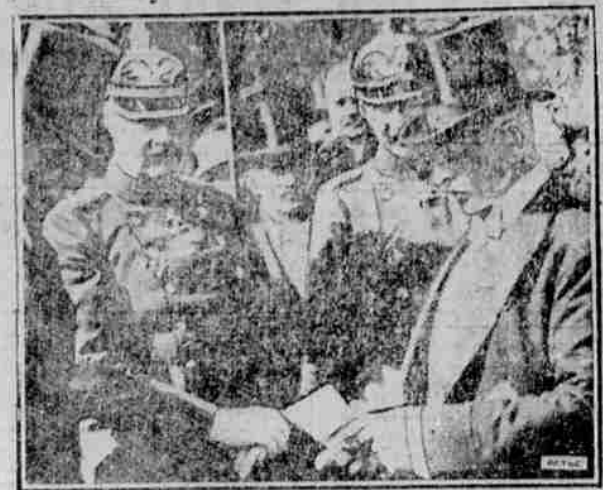

Set by Radio



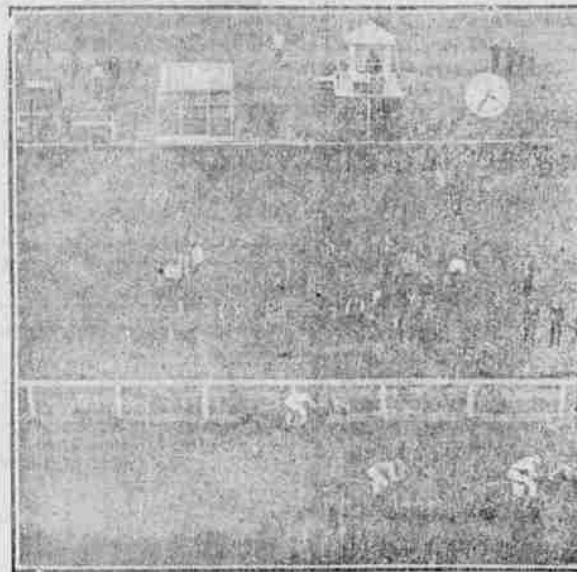
Clocks of all the world may soon be synchronized by radio. Here Paul Sollenberger of the naval observatory at Washington is exchanging time signals with Australia.

Ed's a Highbrow Tabby



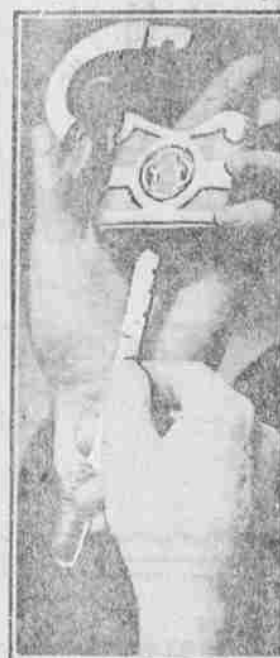

Winning Women's Olympic Hurdle



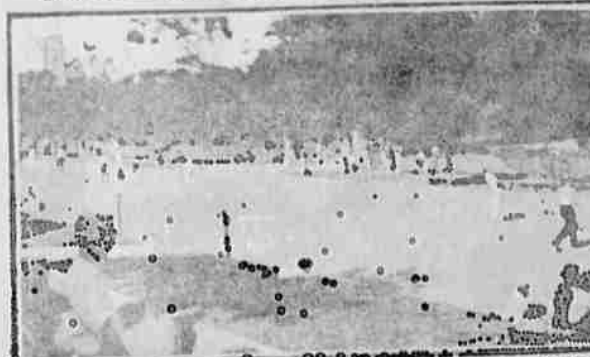

How Northwestern "Mounties" Train Steeds



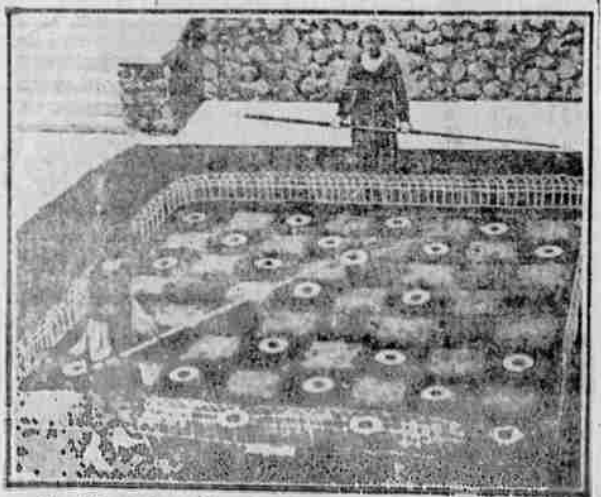
No, horse and rider aren't dead. Just one of the circus tricks the Northwestern Mounted Police teach their horses. "Tockies" have to train their own mounts.
