WADE BROTHERS IN ENTERPRISE

ENTERPRISE, June 5.—A second gasoline and oil distributing station will be established in Enterprise at once, by the Wade Oil company. It will have its plant on the railroad track, immediately east of the Standard Oil station, and will install two large tanks at the beginning. These are now on the way.

From this station the company will distribute gasoline, distillate, kerosene and lubricating oil all over Walla Walla county. It will have one or more auto trucks in service for local and out-of-town delivery.

E. F. Johnson has come as resident manager and will make his home in Enterprise. He says the Wade

company is an Oregon concern which operates as a local concern in the towns in which it is established, after the manner of the chain stores. The local manager is a stock holder and identifies himself with the community in which he operates.

A station has been operating at La Grande for some time, the business having come in from Idaho. The company has no refineries but buys from established producers and manufacturers.

UNEMPLOYMENT IS DECREASING

The Red Cross headquarters announces that during the past month the cases they have handled have not been so numerous as ordinarily, owing to the fact that employment among those who usually seek aid from the Red Cross is increasing.

During the past month 211 families were aided, 237 visits were made to the offices, and 276 telephone calls were made. Of the 211 cases handled, 67 of them were civilian cases and 144 were post war cases.

ROADS IN GOOD CONDITION NOW

The Deal Man's Pass-Hillard road is in good shape now and the tourists are traveling over the other sections on the Old Oregon Trail and the Joseph-La Grande highways without any difficulty. 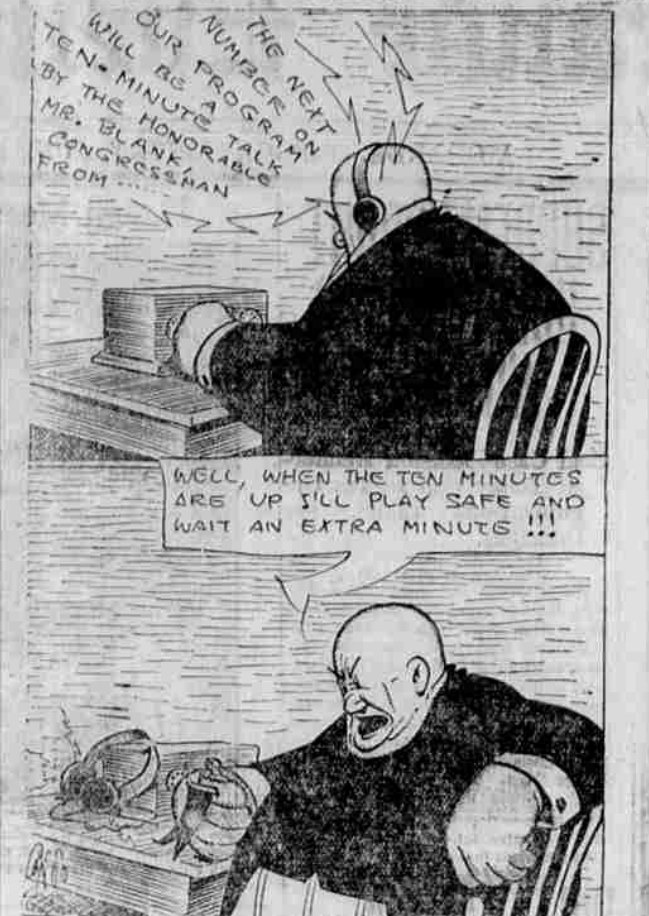
BURGLARS' BREAKFAST

Bishop O'Riley will be well remembered by local people and a number of them have paid him visits since his arrival. While in La Grande he was head of the diocese.

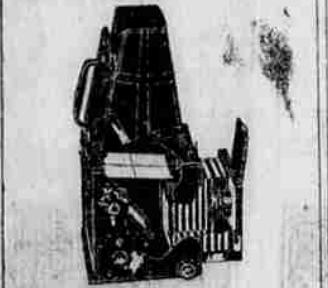
DRUGGED CIGARETTES
