## BAPTISTS OPEN THEIR MEETING

Large Delegation From Baker As Well As From Other Cities Present.

The Grande Ronde association of the Baptist church opened its conference at the Baptist church this morning with an attendance of over sixty. The largest delegation was from Baker, although all of the adjacent towns in this section had delegates in hand. The meeting opened in charge of Moderator J. H. Howard, followed by an address by Rev. A. R. Sifton, of the local Baptist church. Rev. C. H. Bloom then gave a very interesting address on the "Origin and Function of the Church."

The annual sermon by Rev. A. R. Sifton was then given which was pronounced as far above the ordinary. Mrs. Frank Jester led the devotional services in the morning session.

At one o'clock a delicious dinner was served by the Baptist ladies in the church for the visiting delegates.

An added feature in the afternoon program will be a talk by Mrs. Ada Warnock, missionary in South America, who is in La Grande attending the conference, on her work in the tropics. This promises to be a very interesting and delightful address.

The evening session will be devoted to a discussion of "The Church and Evangelism." A number of interesting addresses will be delivered this evening.

Rev. D. Loree, of Cove, will talk on "How I Prepare my Church for Evangelism."

Rev. J. C. Pater's subject will be "How I Prepare my Field for Evangelism."

This will be followed by an address by Rev. E. T. Starkey, of Baker, his subject being, "How I Prepare My Converts for Church Membership."

The final address will be given by Dr. S. J. Reid, of Portland. His subject will be "Evangelism and the Church Life."

The session will open tomorrow morning with a devotional service by Rev. C. A. Waterhouse and following this will come the reading of the church letters. Rev. E. T. Starkey will deliver the sermon in the morning. The sessions will continue until the closing of the morning session on Thursday, which will close the conference.

Among those who were present this morning were: Dr. S. J. Reid, superintendent of evangelism in Oregon, of Portland; Rev. J. C. Anstis, state treasurer, from Portland; Dr. O. C. Wright, general missionary, and Dr. George H. Young, superintendent of religious education, both of Portland, will arrive in La Grande this evening. The local pastor, Rev. A. R. Sifton, extends a hearty welcome to the general public to attend the meeting and he desires to have a large number of the congregations of other churches present.

Morris, Jr., of Mableton, made the motion to that effect. Another motion was presented by R. S. Huston, giving authority to the executive committee which has yet to be selected to prepare a constructive program for a method to replace the primary system that is opposed.
