## DUKE DEVELOPS ITALIAN COLONY

ROME, May 19.—The Duke of the Abruzzi is devoting all his time and energy to the development of the Italian colony of Somaliland and members of the Italian royal family are taking keen interest in his efforts to make it prosperous.

The Duke has just returned from Somaliland with the announcement that 750 acres of land have been prepared for cotton growing and that the first crop is expected this year. Within five years the Duke hopes to provide for irrigation and cultivation of 12,000 acres in the valley of the Told Seebel where the soil is very rich and capable of growing many other crops in addition to cotton.

## LAKE HAS MANY BIRD MUMMIES

JOHANNESBURG, June 8.—Two local Hollanders exploring a hole eight feet in circumference and 200 feet deep in an open field recently found a network of passages containing vast numbers of mummified remains of animals and birds in an extraordinary state of preservation. The passages discovered were of many sizes and some of the fissures are estimated to be 500 feet high. Zoologists here are unable to offer any conjecture as to the origin of the specimens found.

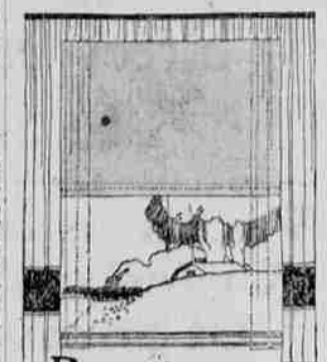
