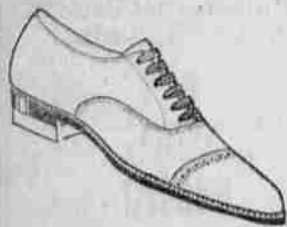

CONSIDER WORK A DISGRACE

Albanians Relegate All Who Have to Toil to Lowest Depths of Society.

TIRANA, Albania, June 5.—Work is a disgrace in Albania. One who is forced to it is immediately ranked as belonging to the lowest orders of Albanian society. As a result of this point of view, American teachers assigned to the American Red Cross Vocational school here had first the task of teaching the 60 or more boys coming from the higher Albanian families that if they wished to learn any trade the idea of spurning the hammer and the saw must be dispelled from their young minds.

When the boys congregated for their lessons in the vocations they all refused to have anything to do with tools. They disdained teaching anything that had to do with work. They refused to use brooms to sweep our their dormitories. They looked at the mallet and chisel with repugnant eyes.

The American teachers met this puzzling situation in a practical way. They began using the tools themselves, freely and naturally, and continued to demonstrate the value and help of a tool to the workers until finally the passive resistance of the young Albanians was completely overcome and they came to use every implement in the shop.

Long centuries of caste had taught the boys that the real gentleman was he who lived in idleness. A few months in the school and the age-long tradition was practically wiped out. The boys now do all the work, including the care of their own rooms and the waiting on the table of the school's faculty. The minds of these youths have been transformed, and constant reference to the upward struggle of American capitalists of industry who achieved their successes through work have imbued each with such spirit of progress that the school, located in the midst of a slovenly, idle population, stands out in bold relief for its industry and zeal.

The students are adopting all sorts of other American characteristics. They have yells and songs; they have class fights and colors, and they have developed a school spirit. They have taken to athletics, baseball being the major sport, followed closely by boxing. Baseball is supervised by Amos B. Kelly, of Albany, N. Y., an old college baseball star.

In boxing their only idea is punch. Boxing "fans" would be delighted with the exhibition put on by the Tirana vocational school. It is practically all straight punching. There are no clinches. Each boxer thins skill is measured by the rapidity and force with which he can land blows on the other man's face without regard to his own protection. Blows are what count to these Albanian boys and they rise and take them like Spartans.

one-third of agricultural Sweden is now electrified, it is proposed that the model farm be a nearly 100 per cent electrically operated as possible so that Swedish farmers, who are now in a position to change horse for electric power, may be enabled to view demonstration of how "white coal" can be utilized in the country.

The request for the electrified model farm comes from the National Association for Electrification of Rural Sweden. In its communication to the government this body points out the necessity for training Swedish farmers in making use of electrical power. It proposes that farm electrification be made a special subject of study at the agricultural schools and colleges of the country.

It is proposed that the model farm be fully equipped with all the latest electrical agricultural devices, so that the farmers may see electrically operated plows, harrows, seeders, harvesters and threshing machines. Motors of different sizes will drive the milk separators and the churn. The new electric device which passes an electric current through an ensilage of cattle fodder to increase its nutritive value is shown.
