GIGANTIC PLAY
GROUND PLANNED

(By Associated Press)
OSAKA, June 9.—The Osaka Municipality plans to establish a gigantic public playground capable of accommodating 70,000 people near the Osaka harbour at the estimated cost of \$120,000 with a view to encouraging public interest in physical development. The ground which belongs to the Ajikawa Land Company of Osaka covers an area of 11,780 taubo. This will be leased from the company on a 20 years' contract. Permanent tracks, fields, stands, a swimming pool, and many other athletic equipments will be established. On an adjoining area, a large baseball ground, a football ground, tennis courts, etc., will be

constructed for the forthcoming Oriental Olympic Athletic Meeting.
