At one time I lived in an isolated part of Wallawa county. We were connected with the outside world by a twenty-mile stretch of mountain road. That road was built in the first place by not more than ten men, and after, when the road needed changing, repairing or constructing the community turned out and did the work.

As to the "Scenic Highway," I understand that the county already has the right-of-way for their part. The city provided in the budget for the year 1922 an item to care for this expense, and all that remains is to build the road from Adams avenue to the site of the Oro Dell "overhead."

Now, if the construction of this piece of road, perhaps slightly over one-half mile in length, means that the Oro Dell overhead will be constructed, or that it will influence the State Highway Commission in the location of the highway at this point, then it seems to me that every man, woman, and boy and girl in the city of La Grande should shoulder a pick and shovel, and see that the road goes through ahead of everything else.

It seems to me that we had better resort to popular subscription than to dump this matter where it now stands.

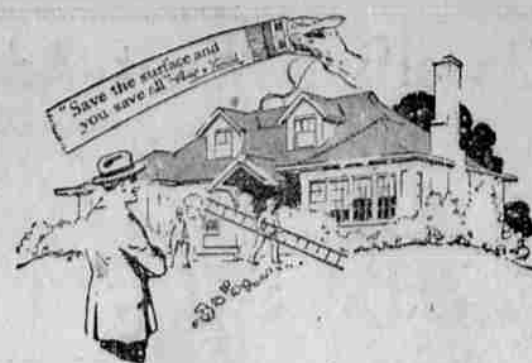
