Every detail of Booth Tarkington's laughable characterization of American boyhood has been faithfully retained for the screen in Marshall Neilan's production "Penrod," the first National attraction which will open at the Arcade Theatre Thursday.  COLVILLE, Wash., June 14.—Arbitration of smoke damage claims filed against the Consolidated Mining and Smelting company of Trail, B. C., before Judge Farin of Nelson, B. C., at Trail, will be arranged after a hearing early in July, according to a Trail report. These claims total over \$200,000, and were brought against the company by nearby farmers and residents, who alleged smoke and fumes from the smelter damaged their crops and livestock. Judge Farin has been selected as arbitrator. No appeal from his judgment will be allowed.
