POP GEER STILL IN THE GAME

CLEVELAND, June 19.—('Pop') Geers, the "Grand Old Man of the Harness Turf," has coached North Randall from his Memphis training quarters to put on the finishing touches for the 1922 Grand Circuit campaign which begins at North Randall June 2. Aged 71, Geers is the oldest driver on the Grand Circuit. He and Gearty he also trains his own horses.

"Pop" has virtually a new stable this year, all but two being trotters. Familiar to Grand Circuit fans are his Sanardo, Peter June and Utah. Peter June with a mark of 2:04 1/2, is his leading trotter.

Geers declared he expects to be seen on the Grand Circuit at least ten more years.

The arrival of his stable brings the total horses now at Randall up to 470. The stables of Walter Cox, London McDonald and several other prominent drivers are still to come.
