LA GRANDE IS WINNER AGAIN

Elgin Baseball Team goes Down in Game Here Yesterday 13 to 4; Heavy Hitting was Feature.

La Grande decisively defeated Elgin yesterday afternoon at Elgin 13 to 4. The game was fraught with heavy hitting on the Pirates' part, 19 hits being registered against DeBoie and Gordon. The game was marred by a number of disputes and some unsportsmanlike conduct on the part of two of the members of the Aggie's team. At the end of the third inning Mason, who appears to be a chronic brawler, and Garrity came near blows but the dispute ended without further trouble.

The Colts sprung the biggest surprise of the season yesterday when they took the Cove Farmers into camp 3 to 2 in a thirteen inning game at Baker. With La Grande unmercifully drubbing the Elginites this put Baker, La Grande and Cove into a three-cornered tie for the leadership. Union came out of the cellar for the first time this year by winning over Haines.

The Pirates played the best baseball of the season yesterday against the Aggies. Only one error, a hit one that struck Crews' foot and rebounded to Rosenbaum, who muffed the ball, went down on the records for the locals. And such an exhibition of hard hitting has not been seen in the Intermountain League for some time. In the eighth inning a Grande made five hits, three of them doubles and one triple. Theison led the day's percentage with four hits out of five times at the plate. Rosenbaum and McGee each got three hits apiece and only one man on the team went hitless. The fellow who failed to boost his batting average was Johnson, who was credited with a sacrifice hit, however.

The Pirates started their onslaught in the first inning when Crews, Workman and Rosenbaum each singled. Rosenbaum's drive brought in Crews and Knight got on bases when he hit Shelton, who put out Rosenbaum.

Neither team scored again until the third when McGee's single scored Theison and Hickey crossed the plate on DeBoie's error. With the count 7 to 0 McGee let up and four Aggies tallied in the last of the third—thus that was the only time the Pirates could reach home and the Pirates tallied one in the fourth, one in the seventh, two in the eighth and two in the ninth.

The Pirates' chances to annex the Intermountain pennant appear stronger than ever before. Their line-up is easily the best in the league, man for man, and with the addition of Workman, the nine men are all batting every pitcher in the league. Yesterday's game brought the team batting average up to .347 and in the individual batting Rosenbaum still holds the lead with an average of .500 with his team mate, Theison, close behind with an average of .473. The race for first batting honors between these two stellar outfielders is beginning to be quite interesting.

Next Sunday La Grande will play Union at La Grande and Elgin will travel to Baker. Cove will have another set-up when they clash with Haines at Cove. The game between Elgin and Baker will be the critical one in next week's schedule and adds point toward a victory for the Colts. If this proves to be the case then the three teams will still be tied for first unless the old dope bucket is kicked out of sight by Haines or Union.
