PLAYWRIGHT IS FOUND GUILTY

French Woman, Accused of Murder of Husband, Gets 20 Years on Daughter's Testimony.

(By Associated Press.)
PARIS, June 22.—Madame Marie Bessarabo, poetess and playwright, was found guilty Wednesday of the premeditated murder of her husband Georges, whose body was found concealed in a trunk at Nancy two years ago. The court found there were extenuating circumstances.
Her daughter by her first husband, who also was on trial, was found not guilty.
Sentence of 20 years at hard labor was imposed.
The principal motive of the murder, it developed at the trial, was the effect of Mme. Bessarabo to obtain a commission of 600,000 francs due the husband for oil concessions in Mexico, where they live prior to 1914.
The first husband of Mme. Bessarabo, Paul Jacques, to whom she was married in Mexico, committed suicide in Paris under strange circumstances in 1914.
Just before the case was given to the jury Wednesday the daughter, who was accused with her mother of killing M. Bessarabo, broke her long silence, accusing her mother of committing the deed two years ago, in their Paris apartment. She said the body was tucked in a trunk and checked to Nancy.
M. Moro-Giafferi, attorney for the defense, who urged the daughter to tell the truth, then turned to the mother, saying: "Confess, or I leave the courtroom."
The daughter, Pauline, told the court that she wanted to call the police, but the mother persuaded her to drag out Bessarabo's own trunk, in which the two—the mother with her right arm useless from disease—laid the body. They then carried it downstairs, took it from one station to another, and finally shipped it to Nancy.
Mme. Bessarabo, who as a novelist is known as Herta and Pauline, maintained the coolest self-possession throughout the trial, but when she was accused in court by her daughter, she rose and, livid with anger, began a confused statement, attempting to show that the body in the trunk was not that of her husband. Finally her story became so confounded that M. Moro-Giafferi had the court adjourn, to continue efforts to secure a confession.

GARMENT WORKERS QUIT

NEW YORK — Fifty thousand workers of men's clothing industry quit their jobs throughout the metropolitan area Wednesday in protest against the manufacturers in letting their employees register union cards. The workers are expected to live in a city where the garment industry is the backbone of the economy. The workers are demanding a 10 percent increase in wages and a shorter work day.

AMUNDSEN IS IN NOME, ALASKA

SEATTLE, June 22.—Capt. Roald Amundsen's expedition with Maud bound on a five-year scientific expedition in the north polar basin region, arrived in Nome, Alaska, Wednesday, 174 days out of Seattle, according to a cablegram from Captain Amundsen. The Maud will remain at Nome only a few hours, and then will proceed to East Cape, Siberia, where five Siberian natives, taken on last year, will be dropped, and a supply of fur clothing taken aboard.

LAST LINK TO BE LET SOON

Bids will be opened by the state highway commission on June 25th for the construction of the last 15 miles of the Oregon Trail to the Blue mountains. This stretch of highway, lying between Dead Man's Pass and Kamela, has been a thorn in the side of tourist traffic and the community in general. Early last spring special stress was laid on the highway commission to rush the contract through in order that the Blue mountains might be open to traffic without hindrance. On two

occasions bids have been opened on this job but were not satisfactory and were turned down.
It is understood that contractors will have the choice of bidding for the completion of the job this year or for completion next year. It is reported that the cost will run from \$125,000 to \$150,000.
